On May 6, 2009, Officer T. Jenne was working an overtime off-duty detail in the Marina Section of The Bluffs. The detail required him to be in full police uniform in a marked patrol vehicle. At approximately 9:28 P.M. Officer Jenne was parked in the parking lot of 1701 Marina Isle Way, monitoring the traffic when he heard a noise which resembled a firework sound at which time he observed a car traveling Westbound towards his location as a white male was seen running from the area of the vehicle. The vehicle continued toward Officer Jenne and pulled into the entrance of the parking lot of 1701 Marina Isle Way, making a left turn then abruptly stopped and put in reverse at a high rate of speed. The vehicle then struck the front of Officer Jenne's patrol vehicle. As he approached the driver's side door, a white male exited the right rear passenger door and fled Westbound behind the condominiums. The driver, **Rhiannon K. Hutton, w/f 12/12/1988**, stayed inside and was extremely flustered and stated that "he was yelling at me" referring to the fleeing subject. Officer Jenne provided the information on the suspect who fled to other road patrol officers. As units were responding to the area, a white male was observed running East of the entrance to the Marina Section of the Bluff's. Officers stopped the subject, who was identified as [REDACTED] who reported that he was the victim of a robbery and shooting. The victim had blood on his clothes and around his buttocks and an apparent entry wound from the bullet which penetrated through his belt. The victim was transported to the Saint Mary's Emergency Trauma Center.

The driver/owner of the 1995 Toyota Camery bearing FL# G772TL, Rhiannon Hutton advised officers on scene that she had just met the two males on Tuesday evening May 5, 2009 at **RJ Gators** in Jupiter. She explained that she started talking to them and the male named [REDACTED] had started texting to hang out together. She told Officer Jenne that she had just picked up both males at the entrance to the River Bluff's and that they started fighting while she was driving. She advised that she did not know the male who fled but stated the two males were friends.

At approximately 12:18 A.M., I conducted a taped interview with Rhiannon Hutton post Miranda at which time she in a sworn taped statement that she understood her rights and that she was providing a voluntary statement. [REDACTED]

At approximately 12:51 A.M., I spoke to Detective Drake who had just completed interviewing the victim at Saint Mary's, which was delayed due to his x-rays. He commenced his interview with the victim at 12:31 A.M. at which time he advised that he and his friend Kim went to take Mike McKernon home and upon arriving at McKernon's residence they were talking about money that McKernon owed [REDACTED] McKernon's mother stated that she would pay him the money that her son owed and so she drove [REDACTED] to Bluff's Square and his mom got

money from the ATM then they went to Walgreen's so that she could purchase a couple items and give him exact change which was \$27.00. He stated that when they were heading back he told McKernon to drop him off at the front of the River Section. They engaged in a short conversation about his baby and he showed her pictures. He was dropped off and telephoned Kim to come pick him up.



As he was calling Kim he was putting his money in his wallet when a female pulled up in a car at the intersection of the River Section and he asked if he could get a ride to the plaza. He explained that she was driving out of the development and she told him to get in and asked his name. He explained that she started to make a left turn then made an abrupt right turn in the intersection and he asked "did you forget something?". He was struck in the head from behind with a blunt object which he described as painful. He stated that the guy in the back seat was screaming at him and yelled "give me your shit man." He stated that he jumped out of the car and the male shot him in the back as he was transitioning to get out. He stated that he started running and an officer stopped him.

While officers were on the perimeter, they located witness, Kim Welfeld. She explained that she was on the telephone with [redacted] when she heard someone yell "Give it up Nigger" then a muffling sound and his phone went dead.

I contacted Kim Welfeld w/f 08/22/1962, who advised that she, and [redacted] and Mike McKernon were hanging pictures in her apartment and they proceeded to take Mike home. An argument ensued over monies owed and [redacted] and Mike's mom left to get money. She stated that she received a call from [redacted], however, there were angry voices in the background and she heard them making a demand stated "Give it up Nigger". She also stated that [redacted] stayed at her house on Tuesday evening and that she did not believe that he went anywhere including RJ Gators.

I spoke with the victim, [redacted] who again provided me with a summary of his statement to Detective Drake. I asked if he went to RJ Gators at all this week which he immediately stated "no it's closed." I asked if he walked around the plaza with a female or sat outside on a chair which again he adamantly denied. I then asked if he text messaged Rhiannon Hutton which he stated that he did not know her. He confirmed that he did not know the defendant and had never met her before. He again confirmed that when he attempted to flee from the vehicle, she accelerated the vehicle to prevent him from exiting while the other male was striking him.

This investigation revealed that the victim's statements in that he did not know the defendant were consistent throughout the investigation. The defendant, Rhianna Hutton did intentionally without lawful authority forcibly, by threat, and/or secretly confine, abduct, imprison, or restrain the victim [redacted] against his will by intentionally and abruptly driving her vehicle at an accelerated speed which would not permit the victim to exit the vehicle. She furthermore; diverted her vehicle from the victim's destination by entering a residential development where she did not reside or know any residents, and drive at an accelerated speed which was witnessed by Officer Jenne during the commission of committing a felony in violation of **Florida State Statute 787.02(2), False Imprisonment**. The defendant did intentionally by force, violence, assault, or putting in fear did knowingly attempt to take away cash from the victim, [redacted] with the intent to permanently deprive victim [redacted] or any other person not the defendant of the property in violation of **Florida Statute 812.13 (1) (2)(c), Robbery**.
