



Court Rules in Town's Favor in Case Brought by the PAC and Union

Today, the Court ruled in favor of the Town, and its residents and businesses, in the lawsuit filed by the Political Action Committee (PAC) and county fire union against the Town. This lawsuit attempted to require a ballot referendum to change the Town's charter to require that Palm Beach County provide fire rescue service indefinitely. The Court found that the ballot question did not comply with Florida Law, the Florida Constitution, or the Town Charter.

Jupiter's electors elected the Council to make decisions that are in the best interest of Town residents and businesses. The lawsuit was an attempt by external entities including the PAC and union to undermine the Council's authority.

The Town is committed to a plan to implement a fire department that provides excellent service in a fiscally responsible manner. On October 1, 2026, the Jupiter Fire Rescue Department will offer a fire rescue service loved by those it protects and the firefighters who serve our community.
