



Town Council Corner: Recent Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council during recent meetings. To see items coming up on agendas for future meetings, visit www.jupiter.fl.us/Agendas. To watch meetings live, or to watch recorded meetings on-demand, visit www.jupiter.fl.us/LIVE.

- **Loxahatchee Business Park South:** Approved a Special Exception application for a 4,146-square foot indoor recreation use on a four acre property located at 803 Maplewood Drive, Unit 36a.
- **Interim Town Manager:** Appointed Frank Kitzerow as the Interim Town Manager.
- **Soma Medical Office:** Approved a site plan application for a 3,893 square foot medical office on a 0.4 acre property located at 351 1st Street.
- **Building Heights Restriction and Bonus Programs Deletion:** Approved Zoning Text Amendments to delete the bonus programs within the U.S. One/Intracoastal Waterway Corridor and Inlet Village Zoning District. Also, to prohibit height variances, administrative height waivers in small scale planned unit developments and to reduce height waiver requests in large scale and small scale planned unit developments.
- **Florida City Government Week:** Proclaimed October 18-24, 2021 as Florida City Government Week.
- **Utility Design Agreement:** Approved a joint participation agreement with Palm Beach County and establishing a budget of \$31,375 for utility design along Church Street.
- **2022 Town Council Meetings:** Approved the 2022 Town Council Meeting schedule.
- **Loxahatchee River Battlefield:** Supported a National Historic Registration application for the location of a circa 1838 battlefield.
- **Town Manager Severance Agreement:** Approved a severance agreement with the Town Manager.
- **Town Manager Search:** Directed Staff to begin the process of identifying executive search firms to identify and hire a new Town Manager.
- **Hamptons at Maplewood (second reading):** Approved a Planned Unit Development (PUD) amendment to increase lot coverage from 35 to 50 percent in a zero-lot line development on 114 acres at the southeast corner of Maplewood Drive and Pinetree Trail.
- **2022 Elections:** Approved an agreement with the Palm Beach County supervisor of Elections for vote processing equipment use and election services for the March 8, 2022 Election and the March 22, 2022 Run-Off Election, if necessary. Also, granted authorization to the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections to distribute, canvass and certify all ballots for the Town General Election, including absentee ballots for the March 8, 2022 Election and the March 22, 2022 Run-Off Election, if necessary.
- **FY 2021 Budget Amendments:** Approved fiscal year 2021 year-end budget amendments.

Kitzerow Named Interim Town Manager

On Monday, November 8, the Town Council voted to appoint Frank Kitzerow as the Interim Town Manager, a position Kitzerow assumed on Wednesday, December 8.



Kitzerow took over as the Town Manager after a long and distinguished career in law enforcement. Most recently, he served as the

Chief of Police and School Safety Specialist for the Palm Beach County School District Police Department, a position he held from 2018 through 2021. Kitzerow previously served the Town of Jupiter as the Chief of Police for 13 years, a position he also held for the City of Portsmouth, Va. from 2003 through 2005. He began his career in law enforcement in 1979 with the Fairfax County, Va. police department.


Kitzerow is nationally recognized as an expert in school safety and serves as the President of the National Association of School and Campus Police Chiefs.

Beach Renourishment Project to Place Sand on Jupiter's Beaches

In December, the Palm Beach County Department of Environmental Resources Management (PBC ERM), in conjunction with the Town of Jupiter, began a project aimed at renourishing a stretch of beach ranging from the Jupiter Reef Club to the Jupiter Inlet. The project is expected to run through the end of January and will place 416,000 cubic yards of sand on the beach. The sand for the project is being taken from an offshore borrow area about 1.7 miles northeast of the Jupiter Inlet.

Beach renourishment projects like this typically take place during the winter months, after sea turtle nesting season is over and before the next season begins. For more information on the project, visit www.pbcerm.com.



Jupiter's 2021 Citizen Survey

Recently, you may have received an invitation to participate in Jupiter's annual citizen survey. Every other year, the Town of Jupiter conducts a survey of its residents to assess their views on services, programs and policies. The results are used to benchmark and compare Jupiter's performance with other towns and cities in Florida and across the nation. This will mark the 11th year that Jupiter has used the National Citizen Survey (NCS) tool to facilitate its resident survey.

The NCS is a survey tool offered by Polco and the International City Manager's Association. By using this tool consistently over several years, Jupiter has been able to monitor its performance over time, and make adjustments based in part on feedback for the community. The survey is mailed in December to a random, anonymous sample of 4,500 households across four geographic areas of the Town. In January, an online version will also be made available for residents who did not receive a mailed survey but wish to participate. Responses are analyzed in a number of different ways (by geography, by demographic groups and by subject area). The final report will be presented at a Town Council meeting in February or March and published on the Town's website at www.jupiter.fl.us/CitizenSurvey. Past survey results are also available on this webpage.

Each year, survey results are considered by the Town Council and Staff as it prepares updates to the Town's annual Strategic Plan and budget. So if you participate in the survey, thank you! Please know that your input is valuable and is used to inform the strategic direction of the Town.

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Polls will be open from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, for the following seats:

Mayor: Three-year term (candidate must live in Jupiter)

First District Seat: Three-year term (candidate must live in the First District)

Second District Seat: Three-year term (candidate must live in the Second District)

All candidates shall be elected by the voters of the Town at large. If a run-off election is necessary, it will be held on Tuesday, March 22, 2022.



Students Invited to Submit Artwork for Drop Savers Poster Contest

In partnership with the Florida Section of the American Water Works Association (FSAWWA), the Town of Jupiter Utilities participates in the annual Drop Savers Poster Contest.



The contest allows participants to have fun while promoting the importance of water conservation in their homes. School-age children can submit entries on white letter size (8.5" x 11") paper portraying water conservation through a slogan, drawing or combination.

Artwork can be done by hand using crayons, paint, color pencils or markers. No highlighters, photos, or computer graphics are permitted.

Posters are judged based on the water conservation theme, originality and artistic ability. Submissions and winners are divided into five age divisions ranging from kindergarten to high school with a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winner for each division. The 2022 contest information was provided to local schools at the beginning of January. Students will submit their entries to their teachers at school, and the deadline to submit artwork to the Town of Jupiter Utilities is Friday, February 18. Winners will be announced by the first week of March and original artwork returned to schools. The 1st place winners from each division will advance to the state level selection process with FSAWWA for additional recognition and prize opportunities. All 15 winners will receive local recognition and prizes.

Juno Street Stormwater Pump Station Construction to Begin in January

Construction of the Juno Street Stormwater Pump Station is planned to start in January, 2022. The work will consist of night work, including lane closures, on Alternate A1A as well as the closure of Old Dixie Highway between Juno Street and Venus Street for an extended period (60-90 days), with intermittent lane closure after that. Funding of the project is through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA).

Currently, the drainage basin on the south side of Center Street is drained through the Seminole Avenue Stormwater Pump Station and discharges to the Loxahatchee River. During large rainfalls, the area often experiences significant flooding. Construction of the Juno Street Stormwater Pump Station will reduce the burden on the Seminole Avenue Pump station and will provide an alternate outfall to the Intracoastal Waterway, which will reduce pollutants introduced to the Loxahatchee River.

As the Weather Cools, Don't Forget Local Open Burn Regulations

Fires are a cozy way to enjoy the cooler weather outside; however, before you light a fire make sure you know Palm Beach County's Open Burn Regulations. These regulations help to ensure the fires do not create a fire hazard in the community.

Per Palm Beach County Ordinance, fires of any kind or size are NOT allowed on or in Palm Beach County beaches and parks. This includes the beaches in Jupiter.

Recreational fires like campfires, cooking fires or fires for warmth are allowed on private property without an open burn permit as long as they are no larger than three feet in diameter. Disposing of trash or debris in a recreational fire is not permitted. Ceremonial fires, which include bonfires and fires for religious purposes, do not require an open burn permit, but do require an approval letter from the Fire Marshall's Office. Both recreational and ceremonial fires are not allowed when a county-wide burn ban is issued by Fire Rescue or the Division of Forestry due to dry conditions and/or elevated fire danger. Michael Barbera Promoted to Deputy Chief

On Monday, November 29, Michael Barbera was promoted to the rank of Deputy Chief of Police for the Town of Jupiter. As the new Deputy Chief, Barbera is second in command of the Jupiter Police Department and oversees the Operations Support Bureau, Patrol Bureau and the Administrative Services Bureau.

Deputy Chief Barbera spent four years in the United States Marine Corps prior to joining the police academy and being hired by the Jupiter Police Department in 1996. He has spent the last 25 years with the JPD and has served in several different positions within the department, including as a Field Training Officer, Street Crimes Agent, Detective, Detective Sergeant, Patrol Captain and Major prior to his current promotion. He has also been the Jupiter Police Department's Honor Guard Commander for the last 10 years.

Deputy Chief Barbera holds a Bachelor's Degree in Public Administration from Barry University and a Master's Degree in Criminology from Florida State University.

Gateway Entry Improvements at Center Street and the Turnpike Underway

In December, the Town completed improvement work on gateway entry features at Center Street and the Turnpike. As part of the work on Center Street and Indiantown Road, the Town regraded and cleaned out the two existing ponds and landscaped the areas, median and intersection. The completed work includes native and landscaping that thrives in dry climates, which enhances the appearance of this critical intersection. With the completion of the work, the

intersection and retention ponds will function and appear as a natural extension of the abutting Sims Creek Preserve and Cinquez Park open space properties. The cleanup of the ponds also improves water quality before it outfalls into Sims Creek and reaches the Loxahatchee River and also provides habitat for wildlife.

The work on the gateway entry at the Turnpike and Indiantown Road will be completed in early 2022. As part this project, landscaping, a new Town

entry sign and a small wetland are being installed. The Turnpike entry feature will also function and appear as a natural extension of the Jupiter Country Club's wetland preserve.

Once the Turnpike gateway entry feature is completed, the remaining phase of the Town Council's Entry Feature Gateways strategic initiative calls for improvements along Indiantown Road at the C-18 canal and I-95.



Community Development Block Grant Program Meeting Notice

The Town of Jupiter will host two public meetings in January to discuss the Town's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program and to solicit input on the proposed program from residents. At these meetings, representatives from the Town will also provide training on the Fair Housing Act. The meetings will be held on January 26 at 11:00 am and 6:00 pm at the Jupiter Community Center (200 Military Trail) in Meeting Room A.

Each year, the Town of Jupiter participates in the CDBG program as a recipient of federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Town receives approximately \$310,000 of CDBG funds annually. The funds seek to address the community development and housing needs within the municipal limits of the Town by achieving the overall goal of decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanded economic development opportunities, principally for low and moderate income persons.

In previous years, the funds have been utilized for water main replacements, drainage improvements, street safety improvements, and playground upgrades in the Town's Charter Neighborhoods, among other things.

2022 Matching Grant Program: Your Neighborhood May Be Eligible to Receive a Grant

Each year, the Town of Jupiter awards Neighborhood Enhancement Grants to eligible projects submitted by neighborhoods in our community. Each grant award can be as much as \$5,000, and can go towards things like entrance signs, landscaping, lighting, security cameras and exterior painting – projects that enhance the look and value of the neighborhood. Neighborhoods are required to provide a dollar-for-dollar match to the awarded funding, and project proposals must come from the neighborhood residents and its association. Applications for the 2022 Town of Jupiter Neighborhood Matching Grant Program will be available online the first week of February and will be due on March 18.
