



### Town Council and CRA Commission Corner: Recent Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council and CRA Commission during recent meetings. #### TOWN COUNCIL

- **Millage Rate, Operating Budgets and Five-Year Community Investment Program:** Approved the Fiscal Year 2023 Millage Rate, Operating Budgets and five-year Community Investment Program (see story below).
- **Truth in Millage:** Approved the preliminary millage rate for the 2023 fiscal year. The rate approved is 2.4633 mills (excluding the debt service millage of 0.1501 mills) and is equal to the rate for 2022.
- **Water Rate Increase:** Authorized a 7.5 percent increase in water rates charged by the Town of Jupiter Water Utilities. The increase will be effective October 1, 2022.
- **Stormwater Rate Increase:** Authorized a 7.0 percent increase to the stormwater rate, effective October 1, 2022.
- **South Loxahatchee Drive Roadway Improvements:** Approved a contract for up to \$478,600 with Sunshine Land Design, Inc. for roadway improvements, including turf block installation, concrete driveway turnout construction, speed bump installation, crosswalk rehabilitation, reworking swales, sod installation, and underground conduit and junction box installation.
- **Interlocal Agreement with Jupiter Inlet District:** Approved an interlocal agreement between the Town of Jupiter and the Jupiter Inlet District for ownership and maintenance of the property located at 500 North Delaware Boulevard, also known as the Taylor Property.
- **Stormwater Improvement Grant:** Approved private stormwater improvement grant agreements with Ocean Dunes HOA and Jupiter Country Club HOA for \$8,809 and \$51,411.05, respectively, that will allow Ocean Dunes to install a diffused air system to improve water quality at its stormwater management lake, and Jupiter Country Club to install aerators and fountains to improve water quality in its stormwater management lake.
- **Collector Roadway Lighting:** Approved a contract in an amount not to exceed \$275,230 with Lazarus Group, Inc. for the installation of underground electrical conduit and electrical junction boxes for roadway lighting along Longshore Drive, Northfork Drive, North Loxahatchee Drive, Old Dixie Highway, Pinetree Trail, Riverside Drive and Seabrook Road.
- **Community Development Block Grant:** Approved the Town of Jupiter 2022-2027 Community Development Block Grant Consolidated Plan and 2022-23 Action Plan.
- **Collection of Solid Waste and Recyclable Materials:** Approved an eight-plus year exclusive franchise agreement with Waste Management, Inc. of Florida for the collection of solid waste and recyclable materials. Under the new agreement, the residential rate will be \$21.95 monthly per residential household.
- **Environmental Task Force:** Updated the purpose and mission of the Town's Environmental Task Force to become more involved in the design and development of environmentally-focused Community Investment Program projects and to help the Town document a Sustainability Plan.
- **Alice Kitching Benton House:** Approved a Local Historic Designation application for a circa 1931 single-family home and accessory storage building located on a 0.2 acre property at 408 Center Street. Also, approved site plan and special exception applications for an adaptive reuse of the structure as a beauty salon.
- **Town Elections Code Amendment:** Amended Chapter 9, Section 9-10 of the Town Code to allow the Town Clerk or designee to appoint qualified Inspectors of Election and a Clerk of Elections for all precinct locations. Also, created Section 9-16 to require all candidates for the office of Mayor or Town Council to file campaign finance reports electronically with the Town Clerk.
- **Police Equipment Contract:** Approved the renewal of a contract with Axon for body worn cameras, conducted electronic weapons, digital evidence storage, and interview room recording systems for a 10-year term for the amount of \$334,339.01 in year one and \$338,493.55 in years two through 10 for a total of \$3,380,780.96.

**First District Seat:** Three-year term (candidate must live in the First District)

All candidates shall be elected by the voters of the Town at large. If a run-off election is necessary, it will be held on Tuesday, March 28, 2023.

#### Candidate Qualifying

Candidate Qualifying for the March 14, 2023, Town of Jupiter election will be held from noon on Tuesday, November 1 through noon on Tuesday, November 15 at the Town Clerk's Office located at 210 Military Trail.

Florida Voter Registration applications are available via the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections website, [www.votepalmbeach.gov](http://www.votepalmbeach.gov). The registration books close on Monday, February 13, 2023.

### New Waste Management Contract to Begin March 1, 2023

In July, Town Council approved a new eight-plus year franchise agreement with Waste Management, Inc. of Florida for the collection of solid waste and recyclable materials. The new contract will take effect on March 1, 2023.

As part of the new contract, all Jupiter households that receive curbside service will receive a new trash cart. All Jupiter residences will receive a 64-gallon cart that is 32 inches by 24 inches wide and 42 inches tall. However, residents have the option to request a larger 96-gallon cart that is 35 inches by 26 inches wide and 43 inches tall. To request the 96-gallon cart, fill out the form located at [www.jupiter.fl.us/TrashCart](http://www.jupiter.fl.us/TrashCart). Requests for the larger cart must be received by Saturday, October 15, 2022.

Beginning March 1, 2023, all trash left on the curb for the weekly pickups must be placed inside of the new trash cart. Bulk items and yard waste do not have to be placed within the trash carts, but can be left on the curb on the appropriate collection days.



### Town and CRA Adopt Millage Rate, Operating Budgets and Five-Year Community Investment Programs (CIP)

Fiscal Year 2023 begins October 1, 2022 and ends September 30, 2023

On September 22, the Town Council adopted the millage (property tax) rate, operating budget, and pay plan for FY2023, and the five-year Community Investment Program (CIP) for FY2023-27. The millage rate for FY2023 is 2.4633, not including debt; including voter-approved debt service, the total millage rate for FY2023 is 2.6134. The FY2023 millage rate, which is stated in terms of dollars per \$1,000 of taxable property value, is 0.0192 mills less than the combined rate for FY2022.

The FY2023 Operating Budget and Pay Plan for all Town of Jupiter funds for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2023 totals \$126.4 million including debt service funds. This represents an \$8.9 million decrease from the prior fiscal year, which had an approved budget of \$135.3 million.

The FY2023-2027 five-year CIP expenditures total \$45.4 million, compared to \$32 million for fiscal years 2022-2026. This represents a \$13.4 million increase, which is mainly due to increased investment in infrastructure for the Town's water utility.

On September 6, the CRA Commission adopted the FY2023 operating budget and five-year CIP for the Community Redevelopment Agency. The CRA operating budget for FY2023 totals \$2.8 million, an increase of approximately \$411,772 over FY2022. The five-year CIP for FY2023-2027 totals \$318,000. A major capital project in the CIP includes \$130,000 for the stabilization of the Riverwalk shoreline.

### Water and Stormwater Rates Increase Beginning October 1

At its regular meeting on August 16, the Town Council approved a 7.5 percent increase to the water rate and a 7.0 percent increase to stormwater rates. The increase takes effect on October 1, 2022. With this adjustment, the average residential water bill will increase from \$37.19 to \$39.98 per month while the typical residential customer's monthly stormwater fee will increase from \$6.17 to \$6.60. October bills will be prorated based on billing cycles. For questions or additional information, please call 561-741-2300.

## Community Development Block Grant Program

Each year, the Town of Jupiter receives approximately \$300,000 in federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. The funds are meant to help address the community development and housing needs within the municipal limits of the Town by achieving the overall goal of decent housing, a suitable living environment and expanded economic development opportunities, primarily for low- and moderate-income persons.

The Town hosted two public meetings in January to seek input from residents for projects and is proposing to use the 2022-23 funds to improve sidewalks and drainage along North Pennock Lane and for housing rehabilitation.

In the past, the Town of Jupiter has used these funds for capital improvement projects (water mains and drainage improvements), parks and playground renovations, athletic scholarships for youth, rehabilitation of homes and emergency financial assistance.



## JupConnect: Get Connected, See Results

On August 15, the Town of Jupiter launched JupConnect, a new platform aimed at aiding Town residents, businesses and visitors to connect with the Town. Through JupConnect, which is available on both Apple and Android mobile devices as well as online through a web portal, residents can submit and track requests, follow requests from other users and get answers to everyday questions.

The JupConnect portal is easy to use as residents can select from a variety of categories to report a concern or to ask for information. Once a request is entered, it is automatically transmitted to the correct Town employee, who can quickly provide the needed answer or have staff address any repairs or issues that need to be fixed. Once the issue is resolved, the resident is notified of the resolution.

## New Town Hall Construction Underway

In August, construction began on Jupiter's new Town Hall building. The new building will replace the current Town Hall, which is more than 40 years old and is not built to withstand a major hurricane should one hit South Florida. During construction, Town Hall, the Community Center and Jupiter Police Department remain open.

Visitors to the Community Center can access the building via Daniels Way or by entering the Municipal Complex through the northern entrance off of Military Trail. Parking for the Community Center is located in the diagonal spots located between the existing Town Hall and the Jupiter Police Department as well as in the lot located to the south of the Community Center.

For the Police Department, guests should enter the Municipal Complex via the northern entrance off of Military Trail, with parking available in the diagonal spots located between the Police Department and the existing Town Hall.

Anyone with business that requires a visit Town Hall should enter the Municipal Complex via the southern entrance off of Military Trail, which will require a u-turn for traffic heading northbound on Military Trail. Parking will be available on the southwestern corner of the parking lot, adjacent to the existing cell phone tower. The electric vehicle charging stations located at Town Hall will remain open during the construction.

## Alice Kitching Benton House Receives Local Historic Designation

At its June 21 meeting, the Town Council voted to approve a Local Historic Designation for a single-family home and accessory storage building located at 408 Center Street. The "Alice Kitching Benton" House was built circa 1931. The house is named after Alice Kitching Benton, who moved to the Jupiter area in the 1910's and became involved in a number of civic organizations.

The architectural style of the house is Wood Frame Vernacular, which was typical of residences built in Jupiter prior to World War II.

## Sawfish Bay Living Shoreline Project Underway

In September, the Town of Jupiter began a multi-year project to enhance the Sawfish Bay basin and create an aquatic preserve that extends the shoreline and incorporates the water around Fullerton and Sawfish Islands. The first phase of the project includes planting mangroves as well as the installation of rock and artificial reefs to protect the shoreline and encourage the growth of coral and oysters while also providing a habitat for marine life.

Living shorelines include mangroves, seagrasses, oysters and other materials that help stabilize the shoreline and submerged areas by slowing down the speed of waves. The current project is part of a Town Council strategic initiative to "enhance the natural vegetation and promotion of our bluewater systems by evaluating and protecting our local seagrass beds."

The Town is working in conjunction with a number of local organizations on the project, including the Jupiter High School Environmental Research Field Studies Academy, Palm Beach County Environmental Resource Management Department, the Jupiter Inlet Foundation and the Jupiter Inlet District.

## Ask the Expert: Homestead Exemption

Floridians know that something unique about living in a state where so many people love to vacation is the Homestead Exemption that is filed with your property taxes. Although this exemption only needs to be filed once for a permanent residence and will then carry over annually, it is important for first-time filers to know the requirements and deadlines for this tax exemption that can significantly reduce their property tax. The Town reached out to the experts at the Palm Beach County Property Appraiser’s Office to find out answers to some of the most frequently asked questions about homestead exemption.

### 1. What is Homestead Exemption and what are the benefits?

Homestead Exemption is a Florida residency-based benefit that saves taxpayers money on their annual November tax bill. The exemption reduces the assessed value of a property by up to \$50,000, which is an annual savings of about \$500 to \$750. After the first year, and every year after, there is a three percent Save Our Homes cap applied to the assessed value. This means the assessed value (where taxes are derived) will not increase by more than three percent per year.

### 2. How do I apply for Homestead Exemption?

Homestead Exemptions must be filed by March 1. Residents can apply online at [pbcgov.org/papa](http://pbcgov.org/papa), in-person at the North County Service Center (3188 PGA Boulevard, 2nd Floor, Palm Beach Gardens) or at one of the sessions hosted at the Jupiter Community Center. To apply for Homestead Exemption, the property owner must have been a Florida resident as of January 1 of the year they are filing, must have owned the property as of January 1 of the year they are filing, and they can’t have any residency-based benefits in another County, State or Country. To apply the property owner will need a valid Florida Driver License or Florida ID, a valid Florida Vehicle Registration or valid Palm Beach County Voters Card, a Social Security Number for all applicants, and immigration documents if the property owner is not a U.S. Citizen.

### 3. Why have my property taxes increased from last year?

Based on the latest housing market trends, all values have changed. If you are a new homeowner, the Homestead Exemption previously applied to the residence belonged to the previous owner. When you purchased the home, the previous Homestead Exemption and the previous Save Our Homes cap from the assessed value no longer apply to the residence.

### 4. Can I rent my Homestead property?

Homestead property can be rented for less than 30 days every year and still maintain the Homestead Exemption. Homestead property rented for more than 30 days but less than 6 months, within the same year, only qualifies for the Homestead Exemption every other year. If the property is rented as of January 1, the Homestead Exemption will be denied. Homestead property rented for more than 6 months is considered to be a commercial property and cannot maintain Homestead Exemption.

### 5. Do I need to live in Florida for a certain amount of time to qualify for Homestead Exemption?

No, Florida does not require a minimum timeframe; in fact, you may never “live” in the Homestead property. To be eligible for a Florida Homestead Exemption, the property must be claimed as the primary residence and meet the rental standards.

### 6. Are there additional exemptions available?

Yes, they include a low income senior citizen exemption for those 65 and older, widow/widower, honorably service-connected disabled veterans, and civilian. Visit [pbcgov.org/papa](http://pbcgov.org/papa) to review a full list of exemptions.

## Jupiter Community Park Renovations Continue
