



## Town Council and CRA Commission Corner: Recent Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council and CRA Commission during recent meetings. ### Town Council

- **Swearing In and Installation of Frank “Andy” Fore to Town Council:** Frank “Andy” Fore was sworn in to fill a vacant Town Council seat. Fore was selected to fill the seat by members of the Town Council at the September 19 meeting and will serve for the remainder of the current term.
- **Fiscal Year 2024 Budget Amendment:** Town Council approved an amendment to the Town’s FY24 General Fund operating and Community Investment Plan (CIP) budgets to establish funding for the Jupiter Fire Rescue Department.
- **Parks Master Plan:** Town Council approved a contract in the amount of \$135,000 with Miller Legg for the development of a Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan.
- **Police Department Vehicles:** Town Council approved a purchase order for 13 Ford Explorers in the amount of \$564,284 under the Florida Sheriff’s Association State Cooperative Contract. Additionally, the Town Council approved the funds to outfit the 13 patrol Ford Explorers in the amount of \$228,697. These will replace existing Jupiter Police Department vehicles that have reached their end of service. Town Council also approved the purchase of five police Ford F-150’s in the amount of \$267,670 under the Florida Sheriff’s Association State Cooperative Contract.
- **Fire Apparatus:** Town Council approved the purchase of two frontline fire engines, one reserve engine, one rescue engine and one aerial ladder in the amount of \$5,603,888 under the Florida Sheriff’s Association State Cooperative Contract. Town Council also approved the purchase of four Quad Cab Braun ambulances in the amount of \$2,101,424 under the Florida Sheriff’s Association State Cooperative Contract.
- **Pickleball Court Conversion:** Town Council approved a contract in the amount of \$339,300 with Creative Contracting Group for tennis court resurfacing at Jupiter Community Park (JCP) and pickleball court conversions at JCP and Abacoa Community Park.
- **Cypress Drive Drainage Improvements:** The Town Council approved a contract with Heavy Civil, Inc. in the amount of \$278,520 for Cypress Drive Drainage Improvements.
- **Utilities Vacuum Excavator:** The Town Council approved a purchase order in the amount of \$108,006.92 for a Vermeer Vacuum Excavator and trailer under the Florida Sheriff’s Association Cooperative Contract.
- **Water Meters:** Town Council approved a purchase order with Empire Pipe and Supply in the amount of \$855,114.71 for water meters and accessories.
- **Jupiter Hammerheads Proclamation:** The Town Council recognized the Jupiter Hammerheads 2023 Florida State League Championship.
- **Deep Injection Well:** Town Council approved a contract with Youngquist Brothers, LLC in the amount of \$21,975,000 for the drilling of a deep injection well at the Utilities Water Treatment Plant.

- **Reverse Osmosis Wells:** Town Council approved a contract with Felix Associates of Florida, Inc. in the amount of \$5,948,286 for the construction of three wells for the Utilities Reverse Osmosis Water Treatment Plant and the construction of 17,000 linear feet of water mains.
- **Parks Maintenance Equipment:** Town Council approved a purchase order with Deere and Company in the amount of \$58,621.62 for a ProGator 2030A Utility Vehicle and a HD SelectSpray sprayer for turf fields.
- **Manatee Law Enforcement Services:** Town Council approved an interlocal agreement with Palm Beach County to enforce State statutes surrounding speed zones in manatee areas.
- **Eastview Manor Playground:** Town Council approved a contract with BDI Marine in the amount of \$195,846.72 for the construction of a playground at Eastview Manor Park. Additionally, Town Council approved the purchase of playground equipment from Kompan in the amount of \$139,588.04.
- **Palmwood Preserve Change to Conservation Land:** Town Council approved changing the Future Land Use designation of three parcels of Town-owned land to “Conservation” and a change to the Zoning Map to designate the land as “Conservation Preservation.” This land is located south of East Frederick Small Road and west of Palmwood Road within the Bears Club development.
- **SUN Trail Grant:** Town Council supported submission of a Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail grant application to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and accepted future maintenance responsibilities for paths, if funding is awarded. The paths would be along U.S. 1, from the Town’s northern boundary over the bridge to north of the Indiantown Road intersection, connecting the U.S. 1 Bridge, Inlet Village, Burt Reynolds Park, Harbourside Place and the Jupiter Riverwalk.
- **Bush Road Stormwater Improvements:** Town Council accepted a Grant Agreement in the amount of \$100,255 from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection for improvements to the stormwater system along Bush Road. The improvements will be aimed at reducing flooding and enhancing the water quality of outfall in the Loxahatchee River.
- **Town Hall Phase II:** Town Council approved the extension of a contract with Song & Associates for Phase II of the new Town Hall project. Phase II includes the demolition of the current Town Hall and old Police Building and the creation of a Town Green on the site.

### CRA Commission

- **Budget Amendment:** The Commission approved a budget amendment for Fiscal Year 2023 that awarded a contract to the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council for an update to the CRA Redevelopment Plan.



### Fire Department Update

The Town of Jupiter is in the implementation phase of the Jupiter Fire Rescue Department (JFRD). The Town has purchased four Quad Cab Braun ambulances and five fire engines, including a ladder truck. The Town is also in the process of hiring the first JFRD Fire Chief, who is expected to be on staff in early 2024. On October 1, 2026, JFRD will be in-service, ready to provide excellent service to the community. The Town received its first engine of its fleet and debuted it at the Town’s There’s Snow Place Like Jupiter event for residents to see. The engine is a 2023 Pierce Saber and can pump 1,500 gallons of water per minute. Conceptual fire station sites at Piatt Place and Indian Creek Park were shared with the public for feedback. ## New Town Hall Now Open

On Tuesday, January 2, the new Town Hall opened to the public. The two-story building includes new Town Council Chambers, offices for Town staff and a customer lobby for permitting, utility bill payment and more. The building also showcases Jupiter’s coastal, small-town feel with its décor and architecture. The facility houses 10 of the Town’s departments including Building, Utilities Customer Service, Engineering and Public Works, Human Resources, Finance, Office of the Town Manager, Town Clerk’s Office, Community Relations, Information Systems, and Planning and Zoning. The first Town Council Meeting in the new Council Chambers will be held on Tuesday, January 16.

The building is decorated with art that highlights Jupiter’s history and coastal vibe from local artists. The Town’s Art Committee collected and selected the artwork.

The Town will host a ribbon cutting ceremony for the new Town Hall on Tuesday, January 16 at 4:00 pm to formally recognize the completion of the New Town Hall.



**Community Development Block Grant Program Meetings Held In January**

Tuesday, January 23, 10:00 am and 5:00 pm

The Town of Jupiter will host two public meetings in January to discuss the Town's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program and to solicit input on the proposed program from residents. At these meetings, representatives from the Town will also provide training on the Fair Housing Act. The meetings will be held on Tuesday, January 23 at 10:00 am and 5:00 pm in the Community Room at the Jupiter Police Department.

Each year, the Town of Jupiter participates in the CDBG program as a recipient of federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The Town receives approximately \$310,000 of CDBG funds annually. The funds seek to address the community development and housing needs within the municipal limits of the Town by achieving the overall goal of decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanded economic development opportunities, principally for low- and moderate-income persons.

In previous years, funds have been used for water main replacements, drainage improvements, street safety improvements and playground upgrades in the Town's charter neighborhoods, among other things.

**New Floridan Aquifer & Surficial Aquifer Wells To Be Built**

The Town is constructing three Floridan Aquifer wells and six surficial aquifer wells. The addition of these wells will help to sustain water supply capacity in an environmental-friendly way. The three Floridan Aquifer wells are currently under construction and will be approximately 1,500 feet deep to supplement raw water to the reverse osmosis water treatment plant.

The surficial aquifer wells produce freshwater that is treated by the Town's nanofiltration water treatment plant. The surficial aquifer expansion includes six wells. Two wells were drilled in 2013 and construction of the remaining wells are anticipated to occur in 2024 and 2031. Extension of underground raw water mains will begin in 2024 along the Island Way corridor to connect the new wells to the Town's Water Treatment Plant.

The additional wells will reduce over withdrawal from existing and aging wells, safeguard raw water quality, and promote long term sustainability of both resources.

**Youth Drop Savers Poster Contest**

Submit Art by February 16

In partnership with the Florida Section American Water Works Association (FSAWWA), the Town of Jupiter Utilities participates in the annual Drop Savers Poster Contest. The poster contest allows participants to have fun and at the same time promote the importance of water conservation in their homes. School-age children are welcome to submit an entry on white letter size (8.5" x 11") paper portraying water conservation through a slogan, drawing or combination. Media allowed include crayons, paint, colored pencils or markers. No highlighters, photos, or computer graphics are permitted. Posters are judged based on the water conservation theme, originality and artistic ability. Submissions and winners are divided into the following divisions: (1) Kindergarten-first grade, (2) second-third grade, (3) fourth-fifth grade, (4) six-eighth grade and (5) ninth-twelfth grade.



Submissions can be submitted through local schools or online by Friday, February 16 at [jupiter.fl.us/DropSavers](http://jupiter.fl.us/DropSavers). First, second and third place winners will be selected for each division. The first-place winners from each division advance to the state level selection process with FSAWWA for additional recognition and prize opportunities.

**2024 Neighborhood Matching Grant Program**

Each year, the Town of Jupiter awards matching grants to eligible projects submitted by neighborhoods in our community. Each grant award can be as much as \$5,000, and can go towards things like entrance signs, landscaping, lighting, security cameras and exterior painting – projects that enhance the look, safety and value of the neighborhood. Neighborhoods are required to provide a dollar-for-dollar match to the awarded funding, and project proposals must come from the neighborhood residents and its association. Applications for the 2024 Town of Jupiter Neighborhood Matching Grant Program will be available online the first week of February and will be due on Thursday, March 15. An optional workshop will be hosted by Neighborhood Services on Thursday, February 8 to go over the program rules and offer technical assistance. Communities who send at least one representative to the workshop will receive an additional 10 points on their application. HOA property managers representing a community are not eligible to receive the bonus points. Communities that were awarded matching grants within the previous three years (2020-2023) are not eligible to apply in 2024. **Deep Injection Well Drilling Work expected to begin in April**

On November 8, the Town Council awarded a \$20 million contract to Youngquist Brothers for construction of a deep injection well (DIW) at the Town's Water Treatment Plant. Deep injection wells are commonly used in Florida for disposal of concentrate or by-product water produced during membrane treatment processes.

For the past 30 years, the Town has been permitted by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) to dispose of reverse osmosis (RO) concentrate to the Southwest Fork of the Loxahatchee. Redirecting RO concentrate from the Loxahatchee River to the DIW is an environmentally conscious approach and expected to eliminate 33,000 pounds of Total Nitrogen per year from entering the Loxahatchee River. The Town's DIW will be 3,300 feet deep and be able to dispose of 11.4 million gallons of water per day.

Drilling of the Town's deep injection well is expected to begin in April 2024 and continue into 2026. Visit [jupiter.fl.us/DeepInjectionWell](http://jupiter.fl.us/DeepInjectionWell) for additional project details.

**West Indiantown Road Widening Project**

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) project aimed at enhancing Indiantown Road from Florida's Turnpike to Central Boulevard has begun. This project is expected to be completed by Fall 2025 and aims to improve traffic flow, safety and infrastructure along the corridor. Get project updates at [fdot.gov](http://fdot.gov).



The project includes the following key improvements:

- Re-alignment and widening of the I-95 northbound to eastbound off-ramp at Indiantown Road, along with the installation of a signal for the exit ramp.
- Widening of Indiantown Road to provide an additional lane in each direction between I-95 and Central Boulevard.
- Widening of the bridge over the C-18 Canal in both directions.
- Introduction of new bike lanes along both eastbound and westbound Indiantown Road from Island Way to Central Boulevard.
- Construction of a new sidewalk on the south side of Indiantown Road from the entrance to Florida's Turnpike to Island Way.
- Upgrades to signage and pavement markings.

During the construction period, some temporary closures and detours are expected, including:

- Temporary lane closures along Indiantown Road, which will be scheduled during off-peak hours to minimize disruptions.
- Occasional detours of the I-95 ramps, which may be required to facilitate certain construction activities.

**Street Sweeping on Town Roads**

Street sweeping services are provided for paved Town-owned roads in pre-designated areas of the Town four times a year. Additionally, street sweeping is performed every week during the months of December, January, February and March on select heavily landscaped streets located in neighborhoods including The Shores, Jupiter Landings, The Hamptons, Martinique, Windsor Park, Canterbury Place, Tuscany, Mallory Creek, Valencia, Somerset, The Island, Antiqua, Cambridge and New Haven. As a reminder, leaves should not be blown into roadways or drains, and during street sweeping days, it's important to limit street parking to ensure the streets are cleaned as thoroughly as possible.

## Ask the Expert: Update on the U.S. 1 Bridge

The U.S. 1 Bridge over the Loxahatchee River and Intracoastal Waterway was closed in March 2023 as part of the Florida Department of Transportation's bridge replacement project. The new bridge will have an additional 17 feet of clearance in height and 35 feet of distance for boat passage. The new bridge will be a twin double-leaf drawbridge, feature a concrete bridge deck to reduce traffic noise, a new tender house and pedestrian overlooks. FDOT answered some questions below to give residents an update on the project.

### 1. When will the bridge be reopened to traffic?

As of December 1, the bridge is 51% complete. The bridge is on schedule to open one lane in each direction by Fall 2024, and the project is projected to be completed in Spring 2026.

### 2. How does this project impact boat and vehicular traffic?

The United States Coast Guard designated a temporary 90-foot channel to ensure that boater access is maintained during the construction of the bridge. Currently the bridge is closed to traffic and vehicles must use Alternate A1A as a detour. This is the case until Fall 2024 when a lane in both directions will open to traffic.

### 3. What are some upcoming milestones in this project?

FDOT completed all pile driving activities in December and is completing the Mechanically Stabilized Earth (MSE) walls on the south side by the end of January. This wall is used to form a stable, strong and durable barrier on the bridge. U.S. 1 roadway construction between Jupiter Cove Drive and Alternate A1A is also expected to be completed by the end of January.

The FBI Academy is internationally recognized for its academic excellence and fewer than 1% of officers nationwide have the opportunity to attend this program.



The Jupiter Police Department also received the FBI LEEDA Award in December for providing FBI LEEDA leadership training to JPD staff.

## Utilities Staff Recognized by FlaWARN

Staff from the Utilities Department were recognized by the Florida Water/Wastewater Agency Response Network (FlaWARN) for Hurricane Ian relief efforts. Seven Town staff members left the comfort of their homes and went to Cape Coral to assist with repairs to damaged water mains after Hurricane Ian devastated the area.

For the ninth year in a row, the Jupiter Police Department is participating in the Pedestrian and Bike Safety High Visibility Enforcement campaign.
