



## Town Council Corner: Recent Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council during recent meetings. ### Town Council

- **Fire Station Design:** Town Council approved a work order with Wantman Group, Inc. for a design and construction criteria package for a fire station and park at the Town-owned property known as Piatt Place. The work order authorizes Wantman Group to develop the design, construction criteria package and site approval for the fire station, emergency signal, utilities, public parking, shade structures, site furniture, a kayak launch and a decorative sidewalk on the property. Once complete, the plans and information collected will be used for bidding out the construction project.
- **Town Vehicle Purchases:** Town Council approved the purchase of 13 vehicles for the Town's Building, Public Works and Utilities Departments, at a total cost of \$802,664. The vehicles, which will be purchased under a City of Tallahassee agreement, include 11 pick-up trucks, one cargo van and a dump truck. Additionally, Town Council approved the purchase of a Ford Expedition for the Town's Fire Rescue Department.
- **Dune Crossover 46 Shower Renovation:** Town Council approved a contract with Creative Contracting Group in an amount not to exceed \$59,300 for the renovation of the shower at Dune Crossover 46. The work will include installing a new shower, a new drain and a water bottle filling station.
- **Town Investment Policy:** Town Council updated the Town's investment policy to include language required by Florida State Statute. The update places restrictions on investment decisions made by the Town's principal investment officer.
- **Wellfield Rehabilitation:** Town Council approved a renewable contract with Centerline Drilling, Inc. for well rehabilitation for the Town's Surficial Aquifer production wells, which supply raw water to the Town's nanofiltration plant. The contract is for \$400,000 in the first year.
- **HVAC Replacements:** Town Council approved a contract in the amount of \$158,500 to replace air conditioning units located in the nanofiltration treatment plant electrical room.
- **Arterial Road Landscaping Improvements:** Town Council approved a contract in the amount of \$73,087.40 for the review and update of landscaping plans and post-design services for Town-maintained landscape areas along A1A, the Riverwalk parking lot along Coastal Way, the Riverwalk near the Lagoon Bridge, U.S. 1, Indiantown Road, Cypress Drive, Island Way, Central Boulevard, Military Trail, Alternate A1A, Toney Penna Drive, Frederick Small Road and Heights Boulevard.
- **Landscape Maintenance:** Town Council approved a Landscape Maintenance Memorandum Agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation for the removal of invasive vegetation on the Jupiter portion of the I-95 and Donald Ross Road interchange.
- **Town Purchasing Procedures:** Town Council approved changes to the Town Code and to the Town procurement policy that will allow for more efficient purchasing parameters.
- **Building Heights:** Town Council approved a Town-initiated zoning text amendment that will alter development standards in regards to height standards. The change will ensure enclosed rooftop mechanical rooms are exempt from height requirements in non-residential and mixed-use buildings only.
- **Vehicle Operations Training:** Town Council authorized the Chief of Police to execute a hold harmless agreement with the City of Palm Beach Gardens allowing the Jupiter Police Department to conduct vehicle training in the North County District Park.
- **Utility Bill and Late Notice Printing:** Town Council approved a one-year extension to the current Utility Bill and Late Notice Printing and Mailing Contract with InfoSend for an estimated amount of \$210,250.
- **Town Playground Improvements:** Town Council approved a work order in an amount not to exceed \$65,730.03 with Wantman Group, Inc. for design services of playground improvements at Jupiter Community Park and FIND Park.
- **Water Valve Replacements:** Town Council awarded a contract in the amount of \$342,600 to Johnson-Davis, Inc. to replace valves in the water transmission system along Toney Penna Drive.
- **Toney Penna Drive and Bush Road Intersection Improvements:** Town Council approved a work order in an amount not to exceed \$158,706.40 with Stanley Consultants, Inc. for engineering design, construction plans and a preliminary cost estimate for intersection improvements at Toney Penna Drive and Bush Road.
- **Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium:** Town Council approved a site plan amendment application for Roger Dean Chevrolet Stadium to amend the approved renovation plans. The renovation plans include remodeling the existing clubhouses, enlarging an approved maintenance building and the construction of two new buildings that will serve as new team training facilities. This plan will keep baseball operating out of the stadium during construction, and there will be minimal impact to the existing parking lots in comparison to the previous plan.
- **Bioscience Land Protection Advisory Board:** Town Council approved a request by Palm Beach County to terminate the Bioscience Land Protection Advisory Board (BLPAB) and the interlocal agreement that created the board. The BLPAB has already voted to sunset the agreement and the County has requested that each municipality that is a member of the agreement approve its termination. Town Council also directed staff to prepare a future roundtable to consider additional options (such as corporate offices) for areas protected for bioscience use.

## Darrel Donatto Sworn in as Town's Fire Chief




In a historic ceremony, Chief Darrel Donatto was sworn in as the first Fire Chief of the Jupiter Fire Rescue Department (JFRD) on Wednesday, January 31.

Chief Donatto brings with him more than four decades of experience in the fire service industry. Twenty of those years, he served at the Town of Palm Beach Fire Rescue Department, including the last five years as the Fire Rescue Chief and Director of Emergency Management. In this role, Donatto oversaw a staff of 80 spread across three fire stations. In 2016, he was named the Florida Fire Chief's Association Fire Chief of the Year, an honor he also received from the State of Florida, State Fire Marshall's Office in 2017. The Town is excited to have his expertise to lead the creation and implementation of the JFRD.

## Fiscal Year 2025 Budget Process to Begin in June

Beginning in June, Town Council will hold a series of public workshops and meetings to discuss the Town's proposed budget for fiscal year 2025, which starts on October 1, 2024. The proposed budget includes funding day-to-day operations, staff expenses, and strategic initiatives. This process ensures that the Town's resources are focused on the areas that are most important to the Town Council and represent the feedback received from residents and businesses.

The budget workshops for the annual operating budget and five-year Community Investment Program (CIP) are tentatively scheduled for Thursday, June 20 and Thursday, August 15. These workshops lead up to the review and approval of the millage rate (property tax rate), budget and CIP in two public hearings in September. The budget and five-year CIP cover the upcoming fiscal year, which begins on October 1 and ends on September 30.

## Hurricane Season Starts June 1 Have a Plan Before It Starts

Hurricanes are part of life for Floridians, and as Floridians know, having a plan for your family, your property and your business is important. Similarly, the Town hopes for the best and prepares for the worst in its storm and severe weather preparations. In the event of a storm, the Town's Emergency Operations Center (EOC), located in the Police Headquarters and Data Center building, becomes the hub for essential staff. The Town's EOC is able to withstand hurricane-force winds up to 192 mph, and provides a safe, centrally-located place for Town staff. The new Town Hall building is also hardened and able to withstand hurricane-force winds up to 180 mph. Members of law enforcement, Town management, communications and Information Systems gather at the EOC to manage activities before, during and after the storm. The Town's Chief of Police acts as Incident Commander during any emergency, coordinating operations among groups of essential staff to ensure the safety of the community. With preparation in mind, create your family's or business' plan before the start of hurricane season on June 1. Consider whether or not you will leave the area if a storm threatens, find out where your nearest shelter is located, create a supply list and organize a plan for pets, boats, homes and other property.

### Landscape and Drainage Storm Prep

Residents can help protect against storm flooding by doing their part to maintain the efficiency of the drainage system as well as protect the natural flooding relief provided by the Town's parks and natural areas. Always remember:

- It is illegal to dump trash and throw debris, including grass clippings, in ditches. If you see anyone dumping trash or vegetation in ditches, contact Utilities at 561-741-2705.
- Keep edges of ditches clear of brush and debris.
- Do not place landscaping debris or yard trimmings on top of drainage inlets, curbs or swales.

If a public or private drainage system is not functioning properly, report it by calling 561-741-2705.

## Remember the Fallen at the Town's Memorial Day Ceremony

## Deep Injection Well to Provide Environmental Benefits

The Town is constructing a deep injection well at the Water Treatment Plant, marking a significant shift in the disposal of by-product water, also known as concentrate, produced during the membrane treatment process.


For the past 30 years, the Town has responsibly managed concentrate disposal by obtaining permits from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection to release reverse osmosis (RO) concentrate into the southwest fork of the Loxahatchee River through a surface water outfall. However, due to nutrient impairments in the Loxahatchee River, surface water discharge is no longer a sustainable method. The redirection of RO concentrate from the Loxahatchee River to the deep injection well is a crucial step towards environmental stewardship, as it is expected to eliminate up to 33,000 pounds of Total Nitrogen per year from entering the river.

Over the past few months, the contractor, Youngquist Brothers, has been preparing the site for the drilling equipment. Drilling of the deep injection well is scheduled to start in June and will be completed in early 2026.

## Pickleball Courts Opening This Spring

Pickleball is the fastest growing sport in the country, and to accommodate the growing need in the Jupiter community, the Town is currently constructing 13 dedicated outdoor pickleball courts. Eight dedicated pickleball courts are being added at Jupiter Community Park (JCP) where the existing three double-lined tennis/pickleball courts were located on the east side of the complex. The three tennis courts on the west side of the complex are also being refurbished as part of the project. In addition, at Abacoa Community Park (ACP), the existing north hockey rink will be repurposed with five dedicated pickleball courts constructed within the hockey rink. The tennis and pickleball courts at JCP and ACP are expected to be completed in mid-April. Once completed, both facilities will be open from 8:00 am to 9:30 pm every Monday through Saturday and from 9:00 am to 8:30 pm on Sunday. 

**Jones Creek Trimming Project Improving Water Quality**

Jones Creek flows into the Loxahatchee River and is connected to a series of canals within the communities of Jupiter River Estates and Maple Isle. Jones Creek has had persistent water quality issues partly due to poor tidal flushing and lack of sunlight caused by overgrown vegetation in the canals. The Town partnered with the property owners along the canal to remove exotic vegetation and trim mangroves along Jones Creek. The project is nearly complete, and trimming efforts have enhanced sunlight penetration through the water's surface. The water's visual clarity has already improved, and residents are noticing a return of aquatic life including manatees to the Creek.

**Town Council Recognizes Utilities Staff For Outstanding Emergency Response**

In February, the Town Council recognized members of the Utilities Department for their outstanding emergency response to an incident in April 2023. On April 28, 2023, a leak was discovered after 5:00 pm in one of the 20,000-gallon bulk sulfuric acid tanks located at the Water Treatment Plant. Plant operations staff on duty at the time took immediate action to assess the situation and ensure the safety of the site, while off-duty maintenance staff were called back in to work to address the leak. Because of the resourcefulness and rapid response of the Town's water plant staff, the leak was quickly contained, and there was no public safety threat, no extensive property damage and no interruption in water delivery.

Utilities staff trains for situations like this leak and showed they were ready to handle the incident. Thank you to all the staff members involved including Rebecca Wilder, Chris McKenzie, Daniel Reid, Scott Talabac, Roberto Pierre, Larry Tress, David Levitz and Paul Mitrovich.



**Public Shares Thoughts on CRA's Future Plans at Public Input Workshop**



## Apply for a Stormwater Grant Today

Applications are open for the Town's Private Stormwater Improvement Grant Program. This program provides financial assistance to homeowner associations and other private entities to fund projects that improve the water quality discharging from their stormwater management systems, provide erosion control and help minimize flooding. The Town will match up to 50% of a project's cost. Associations and private entities interested in this program can apply at [jupiter.fl.us/StormwaterGrant](http://jupiter.fl.us/StormwaterGrant).



Applications can also be mailed to the Town of Jupiter Utilities, 17403 Central Boulevard, Jupiter, FL 33458 or submitted via e-mail to [stormwater@jupiter.fl.us](mailto:stormwater@jupiter.fl.us). If an application is submitted by email, make sure to request a read receipt to ensure it was received, and include "Private SW Improvement Grant Application" in the subject line.

A committee will review all applications received and make awards based on the benefit to the regional stormwater system. Proposals should only include capital improvements to facilities that reduce existing flooding and/or produce benefits to water quality. Routine maintenance tasks are not eligible for funding.

## Protect Jupiter's Natural Water Resources by Avoiding Fertilizer Use During the Rainy Season

Many commercially-available fertilizers contain chemicals and nutrients like nitrogen and phosphorus that can become harmful when introduced into stormwater runoff, negatively affecting the water quality in the Town's creeks and rivers. To combat this issue, the Jupiter Town Council passed an ordinance in October 2018 prohibiting the use of certain fertilizers



during the rainy season, running from June 1 through September 30. Residents, landscapers and lawn care businesses should avoid the use of these certain fertilizers when caring for plant life and lawns. Farms, golf courses and specialized turf areas (such as athletic fields) are exempt from the restrictions, but are encouraged to be careful about selection and fertilizer application during the rainy season.

Many common fertilizers available at home improvement and lawn care stores most likely contain the harmful ingredients and are subject to the ban. There are alternative fertilizers that do not cause harmful runoff. A list of acceptable fertilizers can be found at [bfloridiannow.org](http://bfloridiannow.org).
