


Jupiter's Centennial: A Year of Reflection, Celebration and Connection

Town of Jupiter Municipal Election Results

In the March 11 municipal election, Jim Kuretski was re-elected as Mayor of the Town of Jupiter while Malise Sundstrom was re-elected as a councilor from the Second District. Both Kuretski and Sundstrom will serve a three-year term.

In the Second District, no candidate received greater than 50 percent of the vote, as required by the Town Charter. As a result, a runoff election was held on Tuesday, March 25 between Phyllis Choy and Teri Grooms. 

Town Council and CRA Commission Corner: Recent Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council and CRA Commission during recent meetings. Town Council

- 2024 CRA Plan Amendment:** Town Council adopted the 2024 CRA Plan Amendment. This amendment revises the goals, redevelopment projects and programs of the CRA Plan to align with the community's goals and strategic priorities. The updates are based on feedback gathered from public meetings, stakeholder sessions and focus groups held in 2024. See the full 2024 CRA Plan Amendment at jupiter.fl.us/CRA.
- Well Construction and Rehabilitation:** Town Council approved three contracts related to the drilling of new wells or rehabilitation of existing wells for the Town's Water Utilities. The first contract is with All Webbs Enterprises, Inc. in the annual amount of \$350,000 for repair and rehabilitation services for the Town's Floridan Aquifer production wells. The second contract is with Florida Design Drilling LLC in the amount of \$1,198,225 to drill two surficial aquifer public water supply wells. Town Council also approved a purchase order to the Town's consulting hydrogeologist, JLA Geosciences, in the amount of \$99,063 for professional services in support of the construction of the two new surficial aquifer wells.
- Drainage Improvement Grant:** Town Council approved a grant agreement from the South Florida Water Management District for Dolphin Drive drainage improvements for \$130,000.
- Utility Billing Management System:** Town Council approved contract amendments with N. Harris Computer Corporation in the amount of \$569,593 to upgrade the Utility billing system and customer information software.
- Playground Restoration Projects:** Town Council approved a \$322,274.87 increase to the purchase order with Colliers Project Leaders for professional owner-representative project management services. This includes overseeing playground restoration projects at Indian Creek Park (featuring a spray ground), Jupiter Community Park, Maplewood Park, Abacoa Park, Daily Park, Heights of Jupiter Park and Miracle Moments Park at the Jupiter Community Center.
- Center Street Widening:** Town Council approved an interlocal agreement with the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council (TCRPC) for planning services regarding Palm Beach County's proposed future roadway improvements for Center Street. The Town has requested that the TCRPC conduct a public outreach campaign to engage the community and identify a preferred design for the Center Street corridor east of Loxahatchee River Road.
- Parks and Recreation Master Plan:** Town Council approved an Interlocal Agreement with the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council for planning services for the Town of Jupiter's Parks and Recreation Master Plan.
- Jupiter Music Festival:** Town Council approved a partnership with the Palm Beach North Chamber of Commerce to co-host and sponsor a Jupiter music festival in fall 2025 called Jupiter HarborFest, with an approved sponsorship amount of \$60,000.
- Aicher House:** Town Council approved a contract with Creative Contracting Group in the amount not to exceed \$206,000 to construct a deck and ramp on the historic Aicher House located in Sawfish Bay Park.
- JFRD Fire Stations:** Town Council authorized a supplemental agreement with Kaufman Lynn Construction for the access road at Cinquez Park and the retaining wall at Piatt Place in the amount of \$2,312,969.
- Mapping Software for Police Department:** Town Council approved the purchase of traffic crash and crime scene mapping software from FARO Technologies Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$87,900. This technology will significantly cut the time needed for crash and crime scene investigations preventing evidence loss and decreasing the number of officers needed at the scene.
- Bevel Voluntary Annexation:** Town Council approved an application to annex a 0.2-acre property located at 18019 Highway A1A into the Town of Jupiter. Town Council also approved the Future Land Use Map and zoning designations for the property.
- Wendy's Renovation:** Town Council approved a site plan amendment to remove and replace the Wendy's building located at 626 West Indiantown Road.

CRA Commission

- Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) Plan:** The CRA Commission approved an Interlocal agreement with the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council for planning services and technical assistance regarding the implementation of the CRA Plan.
- CRA Budget Amendments:** The CRA Commission approved amendments to the operating and Community Investment Program (CIP) budgets for fiscal year 2025.

Exciting Playground Renovations Coming to Jupiter Parks

The Town of Jupiter is revamping playgrounds at 11 local parks, replacing outdated equipment, adding new play features, increasing shade and improving accessibility for children of all abilities. These upgrades are part of a five-year capital improvement program aimed at creating safer, more interactive, and inclusive spaces for family fun and outdoor adventure. This year, the Town will break ground on new playgrounds at Jupiter Community Park, Indian Creek Park and Maplewood Park. There will also be a spray ground and restrooms added to Indian Creek Park in the future. Stay updated at jupiter.fl.us/ParkUpdates.



New Lighted Crosswalks Enhance Safe Pedestrian Travel

In an effort to improve pedestrian safety, the Town has installed eight new crosswalks with solar-powered lights within Jupiter, with another four more scheduled to be completed by June.

The new crosswalks are located at:

- Maplewood Drive at Pinetree Trail
- Dakota Drive by Lighthouse Elementary
- South Loxahatchee Drive by Jupiter Elementary
- South Loxahatchee Drive at 6th Street
- South Loxahatchee Drive by 8th Street
- South Old Dixie Highway near Jupiter Medical Center
- Palmfield Way between Coco Lane and Via Rosina

Jupiter Public Safety

The Town of Jupiter places a high value on safety and is committed to ensuring its Public Safety departments work together to set the standard for excellence. The Jupiter Fire Rescue Department (JFRD) has already collaborated closely with the Jupiter Police Department (JPD) on community outreach initiatives, and when JFRD begins providing service on October 1, 2026, they will join forces with JPD in a united effort to protect and serve the community. Together, these departments will ensure that Jupiter continues to lead in public safety, with a shared commitment to the well-being of all residents. Town Holds Groundbreaking on Two New JFRD Stations

The construction of two new Jupiter Fire Rescue Department (JFRD) fire stations is officially underway, with both sites preparing to enhance emergency response and service throughout the community. The new stations will be located at Piatt Place off U.S. 1 and adjacent to Cinquez Park off Indiantown Road. Groundbreaking ceremonies for both stations were held in February.



Piatt Place Station

At the Piatt Place site, next to Burt Reynolds Park, residents will see a construction fence surrounding the area. The site has already been cleared, and the underground parking structure has been demolished. Crews have prepared the site by adding soil and building a retaining wall.



Cinquez Station

At the Cinquez site, workers have begun relocating trees affected by the construction to natural preserve areas within the park and have started work on a new road that will provide access through the park. The location of this fire station was shifted to the southwest corner to maintain distance from the park's iconic Banyan Tree and the popular dog park. Additionally, the walking trail and the lake in the park will remain preserved. These site plan changes were made based on resident feedback, resulting in improved parking, landscaping, and reduced impacts on the surrounding neighborhood.

These new stations will complement the current fire station located off Military Trail, which will be transferred from Palm Beach County Fire Rescue to Jupiter Fire Rescue when the department takes over operations on October 1, 2026.

E-Bike Safety 101: Tips for a Secure and Enjoyable Ride

As e-bikes become more prevalent, knowing the laws, regulations and responsibilities that come along with driving electric devices is paramount. Below are some helpful tips and regulations that pertain to riding an e-bike.



Know the Difference Between an E-Bike and E-Moto: E-bikes are bicycles and can be pedaled, but also have an electric motor. Their speed is capped at 20 miles per hour. An e-moto is an electric motorcycle that can be modified to do up to 70 miles per hour. Under Florida State Statute, it is illegal to ride an e-moto on a sidewalk or roadway. An E-moto can only be ridden on private property.



Know the Traffic Laws: E-bikes are allowed on "any road, path or way that is open to bicycle travel." However, e-bikes riders must abide by all traffic and bicycle laws. This includes riding with traffic and obeying traffic signals.



Protect Yourself: Helmets should be worn by anyone riding a bike. State law requires any rider under the age of 16 to wear a helmet at all times. Riders should also limit distractions and refrain from wearing ear buds while riding. Always remain alert for obstacles, individuals or cars that may enter your pathway.



Stay Visible: Lights should be used and bright colored clothing should be worn to make riders more visible to automobiles and pedestrians alike.



Be Aware of Traffic and Pedestrians: Riders should avoid making erratic moves or sudden changes in direction, and should never weave in and out of traffic. On sidewalks, riders should be courteous to pedestrians. At all times, riders should be aware of how speed effects their ability to slow down or avoid a car, pedestrian or obstacle that may be in their path.

Hurricane Season Starts June 1 - Have a Plan Before It Starts

Hurricanes are part of life for Floridians, and as Floridians know, having a plan for your family, your property and your business is important. Similarly, the Town hopes for the best and prepares for the worst in its storm and severe weather preparations. In the event of a storm, the Town activates its Emergency Operations Center (EOC) in the Town Hall building. Members of law enforcement, Town management, communications and Information Systems gather at the EOC to manage activities before, during and after the storm. The Town's Chief of Police acts as Incident Commander during any emergency, coordinating operations among groups of essential staff to ensure the safety of the community.

To prepare, create your family or business hurricane plan before the start of hurricane season on June 1. Consider whether or not you will leave the area if a storm threatens, find out where your nearest shelter is located, create a supply list and organize a plan for pets, boats, homes and other property.

On the storm website, residents will find the latest Hurricane and Flood Guide, information on drainage maintenance, evacuation routes and safety measures, important emergency numbers, and valuable resources from Palm Beach County, the State of Florida and the National Flood Insurance Program.

Landscape and Drainage Storm Prep

Residents can help protect against storm flooding by doing their part to maintain the efficiency of the drainage system as well as protect the natural flooding relief provided by the Town's parks and natural areas. Always remember:

- It is illegal to dump trash and throw debris, including grass clippings, in ditches. If you see anyone dumping trash or vegetation in ditches, contact the Stormwater Utility at 561-741-2705.
- Keep edges of ditches clear of brush and debris.
- Do not place landscaping debris or yard trimmings on top of drainage inlets, curbs or swales.

If a public or private drainage system is not functioning properly, report it by calling 561-741-2705.

Fiscal Year 2026 Budget Process to Begin in June

Beginning in June, the Town Council will hold a series of public workshops and meetings to discuss the Town’s proposed budget for fiscal year 2026, which begins on October 1, 2025. Day-to-day operations, personnel expenses and funding necessary to work on completing any adopted Strategic Initiatives will be incorporated into the proposed budget. This process ensures that the Town’s resources are focused on the areas that are most important to the Town Council and represent the feedback received from residents and businesses. Workshops for the annual operating budget and five-year Community Investment Program (CIP) will begin in June and lead up to the review and approval of the millage rate (property tax rate), budget and CIP in two public hearings in September. FEMA 2024 Update to Flood Insurance Rate Maps and Flood Insurance Study

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) recently updated the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) and the Flood Insurance Study (FIS) for Palm Beach County. The new maps became effective on December 20, 2024.

The 2024 update takes into account additional factors like storm surge, wave action and extreme tide events, which impact topography and vegetation. As a result, the new FIRM and FIS update includes 2,588 Jupiter properties, adding 621 properties and removing 64 properties from the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA).

For the 621 properties added to the SFHA, residents should be aware that under federal regulations, flood insurance is required for properties in high-risk flood areas if they have a government-backed mortgage.

To find out if your property is in the SFHA or to learn more about flood insurance options, residents can contact the Building Department or their insurance agent. Additionally, information on flood mitigation and how to qualify for reduced flood insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program is available on the Town’s website at jupiter.fl.us/Flood.

One Lane Now Open on U.S. 1 Bridge

In January, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) opened one lane in each direction on the new U.S. 1 Bridge, marking an exciting step forward in the project’s development. Full access to all lanes is expected by Spring 2025, with the project’s completion anticipated by early 2026.

The new bridge will offer 17 feet of additional clearance and feature two 11-foot travel lanes in each direction, along with 8-foot sidewalks and 7-foot bike lanes. Pedestrians will be safely separated from traffic by concrete barriers. One of the most notable features of the bridge is its twin double-leaf drawbridge design, which will include a concrete deck to reduce traffic noise, a new tender house and pedestrian overlooks for added comfort and enjoyment. To celebrate the bridge reopening to traffic, the Jupiter Fire Rescue Fire Truck and Police vehicles crossed the new bridge first, symbolizing its official opening.

Valve and Hydrant Maintenance

Valve and hydrant maintenance is underway throughout the Town’s water service area, which includes the Town’s municipal limits, Juno Beach and sections of unincorporated Palm Beach and Martin Counties. Routine maintenance of water valves and hydrants ensures the operational reliability of water transmission and distribution systems in the event of an emergency.

Hydrant flushing is ongoing in neighborhoods and around Town. Residents may notice discolored water coming from the faucets in their homes during or immediately after these maintenance activities.



Run your shower or faucet for 15-20 minutes to clear up the water coming from your faucet. Please note that despite any discoloration, your water is safe to use. An “out of service” sign will be placed on a hydrant in need of repair. The Utilities Department is aware of all hydrants currently marked out of service and repairs are in process. Call customer service staff with any questions at 561-741-2300.


