


Jupiter's Centennial Celebration Rolls On!

Public Budget Workshops and Hearings: Fiscal Year 2026

The Town of Jupiter's proposed budget for Fiscal Year 2026, which begins October 1, 2025, will be heard in two public budget hearings tentatively set for Thursday, September 4 and Thursday, September 18. Both hearings will be held at 7:00 pm at the Jupiter Town Hall Council Chambers (210 Military Trail).

Public budget workshops are held in advance of the public hearings. This year, the first workshop was held on Wednesday, June 18 and the second is tentatively scheduled for Wednesday, August 13.

Town Council and CRA Commission Corner: Recent Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council and CRA Commission during recent meetings. Town Council

- **Fire Non-Ad Valorem Assessment Study:** Town Council authorized the use of a piggyback contract from the City of Deerfield Beach for the Town to engage in consulting services with Accenture for the Fire Non-Ad Valorem assessment study.
- **Fire Station Construction:** Town Council approved an agreement with Kaufman Lynn Construction, Inc. to build the new fire stations at Cinquez and Piatt Place for a guaranteed maximum price of \$17,319,555. Town Council also approved using \$2,997,831 in surtax funds toward the project. Town Council authorized a supplemental agreement with Kaufman Lynn Construction in the amount of \$8,578,882 for the guaranteed maximum price for site work and signalization at the two fire stations.
- **Interlocal Agreement for Transition to Jupiter Fire Rescue Department (JFRD):** Town Council approved an Interlocal Agreement with Palm Beach County to guide the transition of fire protection and emergency medical services to the Town of Jupiter. This agreement outlines the timeline and process for a phased transition, ensuring uninterrupted service and continued protection for Jupiter residents, businesses and visitors.
- **Public Safety Vehicles:** Town Council approved a purchase order to Duval Ford for a Jupiter Fire Rescue Department Command Staff vehicle in the amount of \$63,695. Town Council also approved the purchase of a police specialty vehicle in the amount of \$178,570.
- **Interoperable Radio Communication:** Town Council approved the first amendment to the Amended and Restated Interlocal Agreement with Palm Beach County for Interoperable Radio Communication.
- **Grant Application:** Town Council authorized the Town to apply for a Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) Grant application for the design of the Piatt Place Park Riverwalk Loop and associated public access improvements.
- **Drainage Improvements:** Town Council approved a contract with CK Contractors and Development in the amount of \$1,115,222 for Dolphin Drive drainage and water main improvements
- **Playground and Restroom Construction:** Town Council approved a purchase order to WGI, Inc. for playground and restroom construction services in the amount of \$128,616.16. The playgrounds included are Maplewood Park, Jupiter Community Park and Indian Creek Park. Town Council also approved a change order of \$202,315.27 to the existing piggyback contract with Rep Services, Inc. (RSI) to support additional work on playground construction at the three parks.
- **Loxa-Lucie Headwaters Initiative:** Town Council approved a resolution to support the Loxa-Lucie Headwaters Initiative, which aims to restore the natural hydrology of lands adjoining the Loxahatchee River and the St. Lucie River.

- **Medical Office Building:** Town Council approved a site plan application to construct a four-story medical office building at 1352 South U.S. Highway 1.
- **Financial Report:** Town Council received a presentation from CBIZ CPA Firm on the Fiscal Year 2024 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR). The presentation highlighted that for the fifth straight year the Town received a clean audit from an independent auditor.
- **Vice-Mayor Selection:** Town Council selected Councilor Ron Delaney to serve as the Vice Mayor for the next year.
- **U-Tiki PUD Amendment:** Town Council approved a small-scale Planned Unit Development (PUD) amendment to reduce the required side corner setback for accessory structures from 35 feet to 17 feet at U-Tiki Beach Waterfront Restaurant and Bar.
- **Neighborhood Matching Grants:** Town Council approved funding for five neighborhood projects through the 2025 Neighborhood Matching Grant Program.
- **Open Space Exotic Plant Removal:** Town Council approved a purchase order to Treecycle Land Clearing, Inc., in the amount of \$72,600 for exotic plant removal at the Town's open space property located at 500 North Delaware.
- **Program for Public Information:** Town Council approved a 5-year update to the Town's Program for Public Information (PPI) for the Community Rating System Program, which is a part of the National Flood Insurance Program. The Town's participation in this program provides residents and businesses located within Special Flood Hazard Areas of the Town to have reduced flood insurance premiums.
- **Department of Environmental Protection Grant:** Town Council approved an amendment to a Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) grant supporting the Town-wide flood vulnerability assessment. The amendment updates deliverable deadlines and revises FDEP forms and exhibits based on recent changes from the State's Office of General Counsel and the Resilient Florida program.
- **World War II Era Barracks Building:** Town Council approved a contract to A. Thomas Construction, Inc., in an amount not to exceed \$217,000 for foundation repairs to the World War II Barracks Building located at 500 Captain Armour's Way.
- **Roadway Striping:** Town Council approved a contract with McShea Contracting, LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$178,116.81, for the annual installation and refurbishment of pavement striping along Town-owned roadways and facilities.

Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA)

- **Financial Report:** The CRA Commission was presented with the Fiscal Year 2024 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report by CBIZ CPA, highlighting that the CRA received a clean audit for the fifth consecutive year.

Playground Upgrades are Coming to Jupiter Parks

As part of a five-year Capital Improvement Plan, the Town is upgrading playgrounds at 12 local parks with a focus on more shade and inclusive features. Resident feedback gathered over the past year through public input sessions, online surveys, social media posts and emails helped shape the designs to better meet the community's needs and create welcoming play spaces for all.

In May and June, the Town officially broke ground on the first three playgrounds - Jupiter Community Park, Indian Creek Park and Maplewood Park. Construction is moving forward and these new and improved playgrounds are expected to open this fall.

Indian Creek Park will also be home to a spray ground and new restrooms in the near future. Stay in the loop on these and future playground renovations at jupiter.fl.us/Playground.



Free Chlorine Maintenance

The Town will conduct free chlorination maintenance from Tuesday, August 12 to Tuesday, September 2. This temporary switch from combined chlorine to free chlorine helps disinfect the water system and prevent bacterial growth.

Free chlorine is a safe disinfectant for drinking water, and its levels will be carefully monitored to meet all regulatory standards. Daily water quality testing will take place throughout the process. Residents may notice a chlorine taste or smell during this time. If you have health concerns, please consult your doctor.

Jupiter Public Safety

The Town of Jupiter places a high value on safety and is committed to ensuring its Public Safety departments work together to set the standard for excellence. The Jupiter Fire Rescue Department (JFRD) has already collaborated closely with the Jupiter Police Department (JPD) on community outreach initiatives, and when JFRD begins providing service on October 1, 2026, they will join forces with JPD in a united effort to protect and serve the community. Together, these departments will ensure that Jupiter continues to lead in public safety, with a shared commitment to the well-being of all residents. E-Bike Safety 101: Stay Safe on Your E-Bike: Use the Right Helmet

Summer is here, and with the rising popularity of electric bikes (e-bikes), it's more important than ever to prioritize safety—especially when it comes to wearing a helmet. E-bikes can reach much higher speeds than traditional bicycles, increasing the risk of serious injury in the event of a crash.

To stay protected, riders should wear a helmet that meets NTA 8776 certification—a safety standard specifically designed for e-bike use. These helmets offer greater coverage and impact protection at higher speeds compared to standard bike helmets. Learn more about E-bike safety tips online at jupiter.fl.us/EBike.

Tips for e-bike helmet safety:

- **Choose the right helmet:** Look for the NTA 8776 label or a helmet designed for higher-speed cycling.
- **Wear it properly:** The helmet should sit level on your head, with the straps snug.
- **Replace after impact:** Helmets should always be replaced after a crash, even if no damage is visible.



Slow Down in Our Town: Back to School Traffic Safety

As students return to school on Monday, August 11, the Jupiter Police Department reminds everyone—drivers, cyclists and e-bike riders—to help keep our roads safe. The Slow Down in Our Town campaign encourages safe speeds and increased awareness throughout the Town, especially in school zones.



Here are some easy safety tips to follow:

- Slow down in school zones—pay attention to flashing yellow lights and speed limits.
- Never pass a stopped school bus that is loading or unloading children.
- Obey school crossing guards and police officers—always stop when directed.
- Keep crosswalks clear and watch for children walking, biking or riding e-bikes.
- Stay alert—no texting or distractions while driving.

Command Staff Complete as Jupiter Fire Rescue Builds for the Future

JFRD has officially filled out its command team with the addition of two experienced leaders this spring.

In April, Robert Ramirez was sworn in as Division Chief of Safety, Training and Wellness, bringing national recognition as a fire service instructor. Ramirez will support staff well-being, ensure a safe work environment and provide the training needed for team members to perform their duties effectively.

Shortly after, Andrew Armenis joined as Division Chief of Fire Prevention & Community Risk Reduction. With over 25 years of experience, most recently as a Battalion Chief at Raytheon Technologies, Armenis will serve as the Town's Fire Marshal.

With its leadership team in place, JFRD is moving forward in building a department the community loves — and employees are proud to serve.

County Commission Approves Jupiter Fire Rescue Department Application to Provide EMS Service

In early June, JFRD achieved another milestone. The Palm Beach County Commission unanimously approved JFRD's Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (COPCN), officially authorizing the department to provide emergency services within the Town beginning on October 1, 2026.

New Entrance Opens at Cinquez Park

As part of the ongoing development of the JFRD's new fire stations, construction continues at both Cinquez and Piatt Place on U.S. Highway 1.



In May, a key milestone was reached with the opening of a new western entrance to Cinquez Park, located approximately 150 feet north of the previous entry point.

Here's what you need to know:

- The new entrance road provides full access to Cinquez Park
- The park and dog area remain open, so visitors can still enjoy their favorite outdoor spaces.

JFRD Awarded \$11,250 Grant for Lifesaving Training Equipment

Jupiter Fire Rescue was awarded an \$11,250 matching grant from the Florida Department of Health to enhance emergency response training.

The funding supported the purchase of advanced manikins that simulate real-life emergencies, helping firefighters and EMTs practice critical lifesaving skills.

These tools support ongoing training as part of the department's commitment to improving emergency response and staying ahead of evolving standards.

JFRD Partners with Aden Perry Foundation to Promote Water Safety

As summer brings more people to Jupiter's waterways, JFRD is reminding residents about the Life Ring Program, created in partnership with the Aden Perry Foundation. The program honors 17-year-old Aden Perry, who tragically lost his life trying to save someone else. In his memory, life rings have been installed at several local parks to provide quick rescue options in water emergencies.

There are nine life rings in four Jupiter parks - Jupiter Community Park, Cinquez Park, Indian Creek Park and Sawfish Bay Park.



Homestead Exemption Outreach

The Homestead Exemption can significantly lower your property taxes—but first-time filers need to apply. Staff from the Palm Beach County Property Appraiser's Office will be at the Jupiter Community Center this fall to assist with applications and property valuation questions.

Applications for Homestead Exemptions are accepted by mail or in person at any time throughout the year. However, for the exemption to be considered for the upcoming tax year, the application must be received by March 1 of the qualifying year. Visit jupiter.fl.us/Homestead for more information.

Jupiter's beloved clocktower at the intersection of Military Trail and Indiantown Road is looking better than ever! After a fresh coat of paint, a thorough cleaning and some TLC, the iconic landmark has been fully restored—and yes, the clock is ticking once again.



Protect Jupiter’s Natural Water Resources by Avoiding Fertilizer Use During the Rainy Season

Many commercially available fertilizers contain chemicals and nutrients like nitrogen and phosphorus that can become harmful when introduced into stormwater runoff, negatively affecting the water quality in the Town’s creeks and rivers. To combat this issue, the Town prohibits the use of certain fertilizers during the rainy season, running from June 1 through



September 30. Residents, landscapers and lawn care businesses should avoid the use of these certain fertilizers when caring for plant life and lawns. Farms, golf courses and specialized turf areas (such as athletic fields) are exempt from the restrictions but are encouraged to be careful about selection and fertilizer application.

Many common fertilizers available at home improvement and lawn care stores most likely contain harmful ingredients and are subject to the ban. There are alternative fertilizers that do not cause harmful runoff. A list of acceptable fertilizers can be found at befloridiannow.org.

Jupiter Launching New Live Webcams at Cinquez Dog Park, Sawfish Bay Park

New community webcams at Cinquez Dog Park and Sawfish Bay Park go live this July, giving residents and visitors a look at some of the Town’s most popular places. These webcams are part of a broader Town Strategic Initiative to spotlight what makes Jupiter such a special place to live and visit.

These real-time (non-recording) streams join the Town’s existing webcam at the Jupiter Veterans Memorial, with additional locations planned at the Jupiter Inlet and the Riverwalk Lagoon Bridge.

Be Prepared this Hurricane Season

If this isn’t your first hurricane season in Florida, you may have already stocked up on water, batteries and non-perishable foods. However, you may have missed some lesser-known tasks that should be on everyone’s hurricane checklist.

Landscaping Check

It is important to properly prune trees and palms to help them withstand winds and to prevent limbs from becoming flying debris in a storm. Prune your trees regularly, but do not prune or landscape when a storm is approaching, since yard waste can become projectiles in the storm. If you hire a landscape company to prune your trees, be sure they use a certified arborist for proper pruning. You can verify a credential or search for a local arborist at TreesAreGood.org.
