**SUBJECT:** FY 2017 Year-End Budget Amendment

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

Staff seeks Town Council approval of Resolution 61-17 providing for an amendment to the fiscal year ending September 30, 2017 operating and CIP budgets. The amendment includes budget transfers and amendments recorded from October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017 as detailed in the attached budget transfer summary. The most significant amendments are listed by fund in the following tables:

#### **General Fund:**

Amendments to the General Fund budget during the second half of the year were required for the following:

- 1. To transfer contingency funds for a donation by the Town Council for the repairs at the Jupiter Lighthouse. \$17,000
- 2. To transfer contingency funds for the hiring of a consultant for the recruitment of the Town Manager. \$25,000
- 3. To transfer contingency funds for the cleaning of A/C ducts in the Police Department. \$15,000
- 4. To transfer contingency funds for hurricane supplies related to hurricane Irma. \$50,000
- 5. To appropriate additional funds for the purchase of the Daniels Way property. \$2,802,898
- 6. To appropriate and transfer funds from the general fund to the workforce housing fund as previously authorized by Town Council. \$1,000,000
- 7. To appropriate funds relating to hurricane Irma debris removal. \$1,300,000
- 8. To appropriate police federal forfeiture funds for evidence storage as authorized by Town Council. \$62.944
- 9. To appropriate and transfer excessive revenues for the town's insurance fund. \$800,000

#### **Community Investment Plan (CIP):**

Amendments to the CIP fund were required for the following:

- 1. Appropriated CIP escrow funds for engineering and vegetative clearing related to the Daniels Way improvements.
- 2. At the direction of Town Council the Community Broadband and Fiber Connection projects have been unfunded and remaining funds were placed back into the CIP fund balance with the midyear

- budget amendments. Due to those projects being unfunded the Riverwalk Camera project is also being eliminated and funds placed back into CIP fund balance.
- 3. Moved up funding from FY18 to FY17 for the renovation of the Town's Civic Center due to the timing of facility rentals.

### **Water and Stormwater:**

2016 and ending September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2017.

Amendments to the Water and Stormwater Fund budgets were required for the following:

- 1. To appropriate funds for hurricane supplies and mutual aid as a result of hurricane Irma. \$75,352
- 2. To appropriate and transfer funds for year-end maintenance costs related to the meter replacement program. \$20,000
- 3. To appropriate Stormwater funds for the joint participation agreement with PBC for the reconstruction of Center St from Thelma Ave to Woodland Estates Dr. \$75,000
- 4. To allocate Stormwater R&R funds due to not receiving LRPI grant funds in FY2017. \$396,027

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 61-17**

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JUPITER, FLORIDA, AMENDING RESOLUTION 80-16, THE TOWN'S BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2017; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Jupiter has adopted its Fiscal Year 2016-2017 Budget and Pay Plan pursuant to Resolution 80-16 on November 1, 2016; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town Manager recognizes that periodic modifications to the adopted budget for the fiscal year are necessary for fiscal management purposes and to implement those changes to the Town Council's fiscal policy which occur after the adoption of the Fiscal Year 2016 - 2017 Budget; and

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JUPITER, FLORIDA:

- **SECTION 1**. The Town Council hereby amends Resolution 80-16, the Town's Budget for Fiscal Year 2016 2017 to provide for certain adjustments and amendments to the Town Council's fiscal policy which it has made during the course of the fiscal year.
- **SECTION 2.** The Town Council hereby adopts those Budget transfers recorded through September 30, 2017 which are attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- **SECTION 3.** To the extent not amended herein, all other provisions of the Annual Budget for Fiscal Year Ending September 30, 2017 remain in full force and effect.
- **SECTION 4.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Resolution is, for any reason, held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Resolution.
- **SECTION 5.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its execution.
