Doing Business with the Town

The Town of Jupiter offers many opportunities for local businesses to do business with the Town. From every day business items to major construction projects, business opportunities are available for all sizes and types of businesses.

In order to find Town of Jupiter bids, as well as those posted by other municipalities in Florida, register on demandstar.com, which allows businesses to find and bid on solicitations. This service allows you to narrow your search based upon the service or product your business offers.

In order to ensure that all goods, materials, supplies and/or services are acquired through a fair and equitable process, the Town abides by all applicable Florida Statutes as well as its own Procurement Policy.

All new vendors with the Town are also required to fill out the Town's New Vendor Package. The package provides the Town with contact information for your business, sets up a way for the Town to pay your business and provides the Town with your W-9 for tax reporting purposes.

Be Proactive and In the Know

While opening a business, or moving your business to a new locations, can come with many questions, one way to alleviate the stress is to know what permitting has been completed, or still needs to be completed, on your potential business location.

The easiest way to get this permitting information, is to place a records request utilizing JupConnect, the Town's customer relationship tool. Requests can be submitted online at jupiter.fl.us/JupConnect, or download the app in the Apple App or Google Play stores.

When submitting a public records request, provide as much information as possible to allow Town staff to retrieve the correct records.

Introducing Thread – A New Social Media Platform

If you haven't heard, Meta, the parent company of both Facebook and Instagram, has introduced a new social media platform, Threads. This platform, which reached 100 million users in just under five days, is a direct competitor to Twitter and provides businesses with a new avenue to reach potential customers. Here are some insights into the new platform, and how it can potentially help your business:

- You can sign up for Threads using your existing Instagram handle.
- While Twitter limits your posts to 280 characters, Threads will allow up to 500 characters, providing you more of a chance to describe a product or service.
- However, whereas Twitter has an in-app messaging platform, Threads does not, meaning it is not possible for a customer to direct message you in the new platform.
- Threads is app based, meaning you cannot access it through a website, whereas Twitter allows access through both venues.
- Threads allows you to post up to 10 pictures at a time while Twitter limits you to just 4.
