


Closing a Century with a Bang

Town and CRA Adopt Millage Rates, Operating Budgets and Five-Year Community Investment Programs (CIP)

Fiscal year 2026 begins October 1, 2025, and ends September 30, 2026

On Thursday, September 18, the Town Council adopted the millage rate, operating budget and pay plan for fiscal year 2026 (FY2026), and the five-year Community Investment Program (CIP) for fiscal years 2026-30. The millage rate for FY2026 is 2.3894. The FY2026 millage rate, which is stated in terms of dollars per \$1,000 of taxable property value, is the same as it was for FY2025. The FY2026 budget and pay plan for all Town of Jupiter funds for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026 totals \$190.6 million. This represents a \$42.9 million increase from the prior fiscal

year, which had an approved budget of \$147.7 million. The FY2026-2030 five-year CIP expenditures total \$124.3 million, compared to \$97.8 million for fiscal years 2025-2029.

On September 4, the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) Commission adopted the FY2026 budget and five-year CIP for the CRA. The CRA budget for FY2026 totals \$3.8 million, a decrease of approximately \$310,000 compared to FY2025. The five-year CRA CIP for FY2026-2030 totals \$3.3 million.

Town Council and CRA Commission Corner: Recent Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council and CRA Commission during recent meetings. Town Council

- **Toney Penna Drive and Bush Road Intersection Improvements:** Town Council approved a contract with M&M Asphalt Maintenance, Inc. for up to \$616,931.85 to improve the intersection of Toney Penna Drive and Bush Road. The project will add an eastbound left-turn lane and a bypass lane on Toney Penna Drive, along with an exclusive left-turn lane on the southbound approach of Bush Road, aiming to enhance traffic flow and safety in the area.
- **Underground Utility Improvements:** Town Council approved an amendment to an existing contract with Deevan, Inc., in an estimated value of \$500,000 for four underground water utility projects. The projects include constructing underground utilities for future restrooms at Indian Creek Park, constructing a watermain with a fire hydrant for the Town's Public Works Storage building, replacing an existing watermain on Carl Street, and the continued installation of water distribution water quality sampling stations.
- **Sims Creek Preserve:** Town Council approved a contract with Sajo Management Group, LLC, for up to \$297,004.60 for the installation of public access improvements at this open space property. The project includes constructing a parking lot and a sidewalk connecting the preserve to Center Street.
- **FY26 Operating Budget, CIP Budget and Millage Rate:** Town Council approved the fiscal year 2026 millage rate, operating budget and five-year Community Investment Program (see article on page 1).
- **Water Main Replacement:** Town Council approved a contract with Felix Civil Construction, LLC, for \$1,157,922 to replace the Floridan Aquifer raw water main crossing beneath Indian Town Road and the C-18 Canal that was damaged by another agency's contractor in 2022. Town Council also directed the Town Attorney to pursue legal action against the contractor responsible for damaging the water main, in order to recover the repair costs.
- **JFRD Temporary Fire Station:** Town Council approved a contract with Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. for up to \$63,139.87 for consulting services related to a temporary fire station at Abacoa Community Park. The temporary station will ensure uninterrupted fire service during renovations of the Military Trail station.
- **Jupiter Police Department (JPD) Memorial Statue:** Town Council approved a \$55,000 purchase order to American Bronze Foundry for the creation of the JPD Memorial Statue. The statue will be installed outside the Police Department to honor officers who have died in the line of duty, as well as all those who serve with the Jupiter Police Department.
- **Sawfish Bay Park Shoreline:** Town Council approved a work order with Calvin Giordano and Associates for an amount of no more than \$257,238.16 for the design and permitting of repairs to the seawall and a new flushing channel at Sawfish Bay Park.
- **Indoor Golf Business:** Town Council approved a Special Exemption application to change the use for a space off Jupiter Park Drive from general industrial to business office. The change allows a golf business to operate in the space with a private indoor golf simulator and putting green.
- **Board and Committee Appointments:** Town Council approved the 2025 appointments for the Town's boards, committees and county-wide organizations.
- **A1A and Jupiter Beach Road Roundabout Decorative Element:** Town Council approved the criteria and process for a decorative public art element for the A1A and Jupiter Beach Road roundabout. The Town's Art Committee is assisting with planning and selecting the aesthetic element.
- **Dover Ditch Living Shoreline Project:** Town Council approved a purchase order to the Village of Tequesta in the amount of \$76,057.96 to reimburse costs associated with the construction of a living shoreline within Dover Ditch. This joint project, funded in part by a grant from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection through the Loxahatchee River Preservation Initiative, will improve stormwater management and water quality prior to discharge into the Loxahatchee River.
- **Public Works Storage Building:** Town Council approved a contract with Ahrens Enterprises, Inc. for Phase II of the Public Works Storage Building project, with a total cost not to exceed \$1,098,251.
- **Backflow Prevention and Cross-Connection Control Amendment:** Town Council approved an amendment to the Town's Municipal Code regarding backflow prevention and cross-connection control for the water system to clarify requirements and responsibilities.
- **Jupiter Community Park Restrooms:** Town Council approved a site plan application to build a one-story building with new park restrooms and electrical equipment at Jupiter Community Park, located at 1201 Island Way.
- **CDBG:** Town Council approved the 2025-2026 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Action Plan in the amount of \$312,843. The grant will be used to fund playground renovations at Daily Park, including the purchase of vibrant new equipment, shade structures, non-toxic artificial turf, a communication board, benches and a water fountain with a bottle filler.
- **Water Valves:** Town Council approved a purchase order to Core and Main LP in the amount of \$81,345.92 for water system valve replacements needed to isolate water mains during repairs, reducing service interruptions.
- **Fire MSTU:** Town Council approved cancelling future participation in the Jupiter MSTU, the taxing mechanism used to fund fire-rescue and emergency medical services from Palm Beach County.
- **PAM Health Rehabilitation Hospital:** Town Council approved an amendment to the Abacoa Workplace and Workplace Limited Subdistrict to redefine the block west of Corporate Way between University Boulevard and Pioneer Road. The Council also approved an individual site plan and special exemption amendments to allow an expansion of the current specialty hospital located off Innovation Way.

CRA Commission

- **FY25 Operating and CIP Budget Amendment:** The CRA Commission approved adjustments to the 2025 fiscal year operating budget. The adjustments will fund the CRA's share of the site and sign work at Piatt Place.
- **FY26 Operating Budget and CIP:** The CRA Commission approved the 2026 fiscal year CRA operating budget and the CRA's five-year Community Investment Program (CIP) (see article on page 1).

Playground Upgrades at Parks

From more shade to inclusive play features, Jupiter's playgrounds are leveling up. Maplewood Park playground opened in August, followed by new playgrounds at Jupiter Community Park and Indian Creek Park in September. These are the first of 12 playgrounds being renovated through the Town's five-year Capital Improvement Program.



Resident feedback gathered through public input sessions, online surveys, social media and emails helped shape the designs to better meet community needs and create welcoming play spaces for all.

Design plans have also been released for the playgrounds at Abacoa Community Park and Heights of Jupiter Park, both scheduled for renovation in 2026, along with Daily Park and the Jupiter Community Center playground. A second phase at Indian Creek Park is planned, with new restrooms coming in 2026 and a spray ground in 2027.

Water and Stormwater Rates Increase Beginning October 1

On September 4, the Town Council approved a 3% water rate increase and a 7% stormwater fee increase, effective October 1.

For the average customer using 10,000 gallons per month, the water bill will rise from \$44.08 to \$45.41. The typical residential monthly stormwater fee will increase from \$7.55 to \$8.08.

The increase will take effect on October 1. For those billing cycles that begin before October 1, the existing rate will be charged through September 30, and the new rate will apply to usage from October 1 through the end of the billing cycle. Any billing cycle that begins after October 1, will be charged the new rate for the entire billing cycle. For more information, email utilitiescustomerservice@jupiter.fl.us or call 561-741-2300.

Staff from the Palm Beach County Property Appraiser's Office will be on hand at the Jupiter Community Center monthly through December to help residents submit their homestead exemption applications and answer any property valuation questions.

Town of Jupiter Elections

Tuesday, March 10

The Town of Jupiter will hold its Municipal Election on Tuesday, March 10, 2026. Two Town Council seats will be on the ballot: a first district seat and a second district seat. Candidates interested in running for these positions may submit their qualifying paperwork to the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall, 210 Military Trail, from noon on Tuesday, November 4, through noon on Tuesday, November 18. To be eligible to run, candidates must be a registered voter in the Town, must have resided in the Town for at least six months before the election and they must live in the district they are running for. All candidates, regardless of district, will be elected by all voters of the Town. If a run-off election is required, it will be held on Tuesday, March 24, 2026. Together, these departments will ensure that Jupiter continues to lead in public safety, with a shared commitment to the well-being of all residents. Chief Barbera joined JPD in 1996 as a police officer and rose through the ranks, serving as Sergeant, Captain, Major, Deputy Chief and most recently, Chief of Police since October 2024. Over his career, he held key roles including Operations Support Commander, District Commander, K-9 Unit Supervisor and Honor Guard Commander, and contributed to divisions such as Criminal Investigations, Special Operations and the Street Crimes Unit.



Don Hennessy Named Interim Chief of Police

On October 3, Don Hennessy began serving as Interim Chief of Police. During his 23 years with the Department, Hennessy served in nearly every level of JPD, most recently as Deputy Chief, where he oversaw all major bureaus and led strategic initiatives within the Town's Emergency Incident Command System.



Hennessy started his JPD career in 2002 as a Communications Officer before becoming a sworn officer in 2007. Over the years, he served on Road Patrol, the Beach Unit and in leadership roles including Sergeant, Captain and Major.

Trash Collection Rate Increase Starting October 1

Beginning October 1, residential trash collection rates will increase by \$0.63 per month, changing from \$23.79 to \$24.42. This monthly cost covers garbage pickup, yard waste, recycling and bulk waste collection.

- **Use lights:** Front white lights and rear red lights are essential, especially at dawn, dusk or night.
- **Wear bright clothing:** Neon or reflective clothing helps drivers and pedestrians spot you quickly.
- **Add reflectors:** Make sure your bike has reflectors on pedals, wheels and the frame.
- **Ride predictably:** Signal turns and avoid weaving between cars.

JFRD Celebrates Two-Year Anniversary

JFRD marked its two-year anniversary on August 15. Established by the Town Council on August 15, 2023, the department has made significant progress in building a full-service fire and emergency medical team for the Town of Jupiter. In the past two years, JFRD has hired its complete command team, purchased all fire and emergency medical apparatus, obtained state recognition as a fire department, secured its county Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (COPCN) and received its State ALS Transport License.

The department has also begun construction on two new fire stations and acquired a temporary station to maintain continuity of services. JFRD remains on budget and will begin providing services to the Town of Jupiter on October 1, 2026. This two-year milestone highlights the dedication and hard work of the department as it prepares to be a fire department that the community loves and its staff are proud to serve.

Temporary Fire Station Coming to Abacoa Community Park

To ensure uninterrupted fire services in Abacoa and surrounding areas while the County transitions out of station 16 and the Town assumes operations, a temporary Jupiter Fire Rescue station will be set up in the northwest corner of Abacoa Community Park. It will be located in the parking area near Greenway Drive and Independence Middle School.

The station will be fully operational, staffed with firefighters, and house a fire engine and rescue vehicle. Fire vehicles will safely exit the site by turning onto Greenway Drive, providing a quick and reliable emergency response for the community.

Public AEDs Available in Six Town Parks



Last fall, 11 AEDs were placed in six Town parks so that residents have access to the life-saving tool if a cardiac emergency happens. These AEDs were strategically placed where

both adult and youth athletics are hosted to ensure timely assistance during emergencies. The AEDs are located at Jupiter Village Park, Maplewood Park, Cinquez Park, Lighthouse Park, Jupiter Community Park and Abacoa Community Park.

In an emergency, residents call 911 and receive a code from the operator to access the AED, and the machine walks the user through its use. For instructions on how to operate an AED, visit jupiter.fl.us/PublicSafety.

New Athletic Facility Usage Policy

The Town of Jupiter has implemented an Athletic Facility Usage Policy and Fee Schedule to provide a clear, consistent process for using Town athletic facilities. The policy prioritizes access for Jupiter residents while also welcoming outside user groups.

With a new tiered structure, the policy balances the needs of residents, Town-run programs, recreational users and competitive leagues. Its goal is to maximize use of resources, promote community engagement and encourage healthy lifestyles, all while maintaining facilities in a fiscally responsible way. Backflow Prevention

Routine backflow testing helps maintain the high quality of Jupiter’s drinking water. Backflow occurs when water flows in the wrong direction in pipes, potentially pulling in non-drinking water from sources such as sprinklers, pools, or wells. To protect drinking water, certain properties are required by the state to have backflow prevention devices installed and then tested and certified by a licensed technician. Testing is required every two years for residential and every year for non-residential properties.

The Town provides notice 90 days before the certification deadline so residents have time to complete testing. Testing, which must be done by a certified backflow technician, typically costs between \$50 and \$150 for small devices and between \$150 and \$300 for large devices. If a device fails, it must be repaired and retested until it passes. Only licensed plumbers can install new devices. Jupiter Utilities Honored with State and National Awards

Jupiter’s Utilities Department has been recognized with both state and national awards in 2025 for its work in protecting the environment and serving the community.

On June 12, the Florida Stormwater Association presented the Town with the Outstanding Achievement Award in the Stormwater Program category. The award highlighted efforts to restore water quality in the Loxahatchee River, support residents through the Private Stormwater Grant Program, and major projects such as the deep injection well at the Water Treatment Plant.

For the third year in a row, the department also received national recognition as a “Utility of the Future Today” from the Water Environment Federation. The honor highlights utilities that focus on efficiency, innovation, sustainability and community engagement.

These achievements demonstrate Jupiter’s ongoing commitment to environmental stewardship and high-quality service for residents.

CDBG Funds at Work: Town Invites Resident Input

The Town of Jupiter will host two public meetings on January 29 at 11:00 am and 5:00 pm in the Police Department Community Room, 196 Military Trail, to hear from residents about the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. Both sessions will feature the same presentation.

Since 2012, Jupiter has received about \$300,000 each year through CDBG to support local projects. These funds have helped renovate parks, provide athletic scholarships, repair roofs for low-income homeowners and upgrade water and drainage systems in neighborhoods.
