



Town Council Corner: Recent Policy Actions

Below is a summary of some of the approvals and decisions made by the Town Council during recent meetings. To see items coming up on agendas for future meetings, visit jupiter.fl.us/Agendas. To watch meetings live, or to watch recorded meetings on-demand, visit jupiter.fl.us/Live.

- Police Collective Bargaining Agreement:** Town Council approved a contract with the Police Benevolent Association, which represents the Town's Police Officers and Sergeants. The contract was retroactive to October 1, 2025, and expires on September 30, 2028. Town Council also approved a Memorandum of Agreement regarding future proposed changes to the Police Retirement Fund.
- Stormwater Inspection, Cleaning and Repair Services:** Town Council approved a one-year renewable unit price contract with Hinterland Group, LLC in an amount not to exceed \$775,000 for the cleaning, video inspection and repair of stormwater pipes, as needed. The contract contains provisions for renewal for up to three additional one-year terms.
- Fire Rescue Dispatch:** Town Council approved an Interlocal Agreement with the City of Palm Beach Gardens for dispatch services for the Jupiter Fire Rescue Department.
- Town Fleet Fuel Purchase:** Town Council approved purchase orders with Pro Energy, LLC for the Town's fleet fuel and emergency standby generator fuel. The purchases would be made using a piggyback of a State of Florida contract.
- Town Vehicle Purchase:** Town Council approved the purchase of four Ford F-150 Super Cab 4WD trucks, a Ford Explorer 4WD SUV, a Ford F-350 Super Cab 4WD truck with an electric service crane, and a Ford F-600 4WD with a 31' hydraulic Fassi crane for the Town's Utilities Department. The total cost of the purchase is \$486,743.
- Proposed Suni Sands Mediation Settlement:** Town Council approved a Mediation Settlement Agreement with the owners of Suni Sands. The settlement was not a development approval but established a framework for the Town and the property owner to move forward and preserve a historically significant site by transferring 5.48 acres of the property to the Town through a deed transfer and a purchase agreement. To develop the property, the owner will still need to submit all applicable development applications and obtain Town Council approval on dates yet to be determined.
- Purchase and Sale Agreement with MESO Scale Diagnostics:** Town Council approved the sale of a 9-acre parcel to MESO Scale Diagnostics, LLC (MSD). The parcel is located north of Indiantown Road, just west of the Florida Turnpike, and was conveyed to the Town in 2014, with its use limited to bioscience or life science uses, or as open space. MSD is a global leader in the development, manufacture, and commercialization of measurement instruments for medical research and development and will use the land in accordance with the property's required use. The Town had the property appraised, and MSD will pay the appraised amount of \$9 million.
- Abacoa Temporary Fire Station:** Town Council approved an amendment to Unit Price Contract W2334 with Deevan, Inc. and an associated Work Order to perform underground water utility work for the Abacoa Temporary Fire Station in the amount of \$142,400.
- Historical and Archaeological Services Contract:** Town Council approved a continuing services contract with Advanced Archaeology Inc. for historic and archaeological services in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 annually for a term of three (3) years. The contract also includes two (2) 1-year renewal options.
- Road Resurfacing Work Orders:** Town Council approved two work orders for road resurfacing projects within the Town. The first work order is to LP Asphalt, LLC in the amount of \$1,450,637 for roads in Egret Landing. The second work order is also to LP Asphalt, LLC in the amount of \$163,889 for the resurfacing of Dolphin Drive.
- Temporary Fire Station Work Order:** Town Council approved a work order in the amount of \$199,872 with Arkest, LLC for the relocation, anchorage, site improvements, interior renovations, plumbing, and electrical for the Town's Abacoa Temporary Fire Station.
- Water Plant Repairs and Replacements:** Town Council approved a pair of contracts for repairs and replacements to the Town's water plant. The first contract, with Lawrence Lee Construction Services, Inc. for an amount of \$1,976,600, is to replace the Nanofiltration Acid Tanks. The second contract, with Grace Roofing & Sheet Metal Enterprise, is for an amount of \$527,741 and is to perform roof repairs and replacement on the Nanofiltration building.
- Getz Annexation and Map Amendments:** Town Council approved an application for a voluntary annexation of a 0.36-acre property located on the north side of Center Street, just west of North Pennock Lane. Town Council also approved amendments to the Future Land Use and Zoning Map regarding the property.
- Police Pension Ordinance Update:** Town Council approved three amendments to the Town Code regarding the Police Officers' Pension Plan. One amendment increased the supplemental retirement benefit available to offset healthcare insurance premiums, another removed the employee funding requirement for active members who enter DROP on or after October 1, 2025, and the final corrected a scrivener's error that occurred during the last change to several sections of the Town Code that relate to the Police Officers' Pension.
- Planet Kids Annexation and Map Amendments:** Town Council approved an application for a voluntary annexation of a 1.4-acre property located on 174th Street North, south of Indiantown Road and west of 68th Terrace North. Town Council also approved the amendments to the Future Land Use and Zoning Map regarding the property.
- Furniture and Fixtures:** Town Council approved a purchase order with JC White in the amount of \$228,009 for furniture and fixtures for the Town's two new fire stations. The purchase will be made using a State of Florida contract.
- Western Indiantown Road Improvements Phase II:** Town Council approved a Locally Funded Agreement (LFA) with the Florida Department of Transportation. The LFA would obligate the Town to pay \$1,108,872 for construction, engineering, and inspection services for roadway improvements on westbound Indiantown Road from just west of Central Boulevard to just west of 67th Road North.
- Piatt Public Safety Marina and Park - Site Plan & Special Exception:** Town Council approved a site plan for a public safety marina and park site plan. Phase One of the project established the public safety marina and supporting infrastructure to improve marine emergency response capabilities on the Loxahatchee River and surrounding waterways. Phase two will continue development of the site with additional parking and public access improvements.
- Non-Ad Valorem Agreements with Tax Collector and Property Appraiser:** Town Council approved agreements with the Palm Beach County Tax Collector and the Palm Beach County Property Appraiser for the implementation and collection of a non-ad valorem assessment for fire services. Town Council has not determined if a non-ad valorem assessment will be used within Jupiter, but by Florida Statute must have the agreements in place before determining to do so.

The Citizen Survey Results Are In

Every other year, the Town conducts a citizen survey of its residents to identify areas of strength and areas that have opportunity for improvement. The 2025 survey was sent to 3,000 randomly selected households and received 368 total responses. Overall, the Town received high marks on livability and quality of life issues, but received some good feedback on areas to improve, particularly related to traffic, affordability and land use. Town Council Approves Settlement Agreement for Suni Sands Property

A settlement agreement to the mediation over Suni Sands was approved by Town Council in January of 2026. The agreement requires the property owner to submit all applicable development applications and to seek Town Council approval for development of the property. Should Town Council approve the development, the agreement transfers 5.48 of the 10.4 acres of the property to the Town, including the 4.07-acre Suni Sands Shell Midden, the right-of-way of the Celestial Railway and a 1.41 acre parcel thought to be the original terminus of the Celestial Railway and Jupiter's first commercial center.

The Suni Sands Shell Midden is recognized as one of the most significant archaeological sites in the area, containing evidence of early Indigenous habitation along the Loxahatchee River. Preservation of the midden has long been a priority for the Town. The settlement agreement establishes a framework that allows the Town to protect historically significant portions of the property while providing a defined process for considering potential development on the remaining land.

Fiscal Year 2026 Budget Process to Begin in June

Beginning in June, the Town Council will hold a series of public workshops and meetings to discuss the Town's proposed budget for fiscal year 2027, which starts on October 1, 2026. Day-to-day operations, staff expenses and funding necessary to work on completing any adopted strategic initiatives will be incorporated into the proposed budget. This process ensures that the Town's resources are focused on the areas that are most important to the Town Council and represent the feedback received from residents and businesses.

The budget Workshops for the annual operating budget and five-year Community Investment Program (CIP) will be held on Thursday, June 18 and Thursday, August 13. These workshops lead up to the review and approval of the millage rate (property tax rate), budget and CIP in two public hearings in September. The budget and five-year CIP cover the upcoming fiscal year, which begins on October 1 and ends on September 30. Check the Town's social media and website for Budget workshops and hearing dates. Impaired Driving Enforcement Campaign

The Jupiter Police Department, in coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation, is conducting additional enforcement of impaired driving violations on our roadways. Alcohol and other substances reduce the function of the brain by impairing thinking, reasoning, and muscle coordination, which are essential to operating a vehicle safely.



This enforcement campaign will be conducted through September 2026.

Distracted Driving Enforcement Campaign

The Jupiter Police Department, in coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation, is conducting additional enforcement of distracted driving violations within the Town. Distracted driving continues to be one of the most significant traffic safety issues nationwide. It occurs when drivers divert their attention from driving, such as texting, adjusting the radio, or engaging in any other distraction from the roadway.



This enforcement campaign will be conducted through September 2026.

Speed and Aggressive Driving Enforcement

The Jupiter Police Department in coordination with the Florida Department of Transportation is conducting additional enforcement of speed and aggressive driving violations within the Town. Speed and aggressive driving are one of the biggest traffic issues and through this additional enforcement and educational awareness, our goal is to decrease violations and protect all roadway users.

This enforcement campaign will be conducted now through September 2026.

High Visibility Enforcement (HVE) Pedestrian and Bike Safety Enforcement

In an ongoing effort to prevent traffic crashes and protect pedestrians and bicyclists on our roadways, the Jupiter Police Department is participating in the state-wide High Visibility Enforcement (HVE) campaign.



As part of this campaign, the Jupiter Police Department is conducting high-visibility enforcement through May 2026 along Indiantown Road from Pennock Lane east to Old Dixie Highway.

Our goal is to mitigate crashes by increasing awareness of and compliance with traffic laws that protect the safety of pedestrians and bicyclists on our roads, thereby reducing related injuries and fatalities within the Town of Jupiter.

Security Tip: Watch for Phishing Emails

Cybercriminals often find ways to bypass email security filters by using trusted websites or social engineering tactics. Phishing emails may appear to come from a trusted source, such as a manager or IT department, and attempt to trick you into sharing sensitive information, sending files, or transferring money.

Always pause before responding to unexpected emails, especially those requesting confidential information or urgent action. If something feels suspicious, verify the request through a trusted source before acting. Staying alert is one of the best ways to protect yourself.

Stay Alert: Protect Yourself from Scams

The Jupiter Police Department is reminding residents to remain vigilant as scammers continue to target communities through increasingly sophisticated schemes. Many fraud groups use well-planned, scripted tactics designed to create confusion, urgency, and fear, tricking victims into sending money or handing over valuables. Watch out for the red flags below.

- Unexpected calls or messages pretending to be banks, police, or family
- Pressure to act quickly or secretly
- Requests for cash, bitcoin, or gift cards
- Being told to hand money or valuables to someone in a vehicle

Jupiter Fire Rescue Gears Up for a Historic Summer

The Jupiter Fire Rescue Department continues making significant progress as it prepares to officially launch on October 1, 2026. This summer will mark several important milestones for the new department.

On June 1, the Town will proudly swear in 90 operational firefighters, marking a historic moment as JFRD builds its inaugural team. The community will also be invited to celebrate the opening of two new fire stations with ribbon-cutting and push-in ceremonies at the Cinquez and Piatt Place stations.

Later this summer, residents will have the opportunity to connect with their new fire rescue team during community open house events at both stations, offering a chance to meet firefighters, tour the facilities, and learn more about the services JFRD will provide.

JFRD Team Continues to Grow

The Jupiter Fire Rescue Department is excited to announce five key leadership appointments, including three Battalion Chiefs and two Captains who bring decades of experience and specialized expertise to the organization.

Battalion Chief Jason Bohan joins JFRD from Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue and also served 23 years with the Fort Lauderdale Police SWAT team as a Team Leader and SWAT Medic. Battalion Chief Jason Sekula, formerly with the City of Boca Raton, brings 22 years of experience and previously served as Division Chief of Special Operations overseeing Marine Rescue, Technical Rescue and Regional Hazmat response. Battalion Chief Mike Stallings Jr. brings more than 30 years of fire service experience and retired as a District Fire Chief with the City of Orlando.

EMS Captain Matt Keeler, a third-generation firefighter with 26 years at Boynton Beach Fire Rescue, currently chairs the Palm Beach County EMS Advisory Council. Training Captain Kyle Foley joins from Jacksonville Fire Rescue and served with Florida Urban Search and Rescue Task Force 5, deploying to major disasters including the 2021 Surfside building collapse.

Stormwater Grant Applications Are Currently Being Accepted

Applications for the Town's Private Stormwater Improvement Grant program are evaluated twice a year, in September and March. The program offers financial assistance to homeowner associations and commercial properties for qualifying projects that improve water quality discharging from their stormwater management systems, implement erosion control or minimize flooding. The Town may award up to 50% of construction cost. Grant applications can be submitted electronically at jupiter.fl.us/StormwaterGrant, emailed to stormwater@jupiter.fl.us, or mailed to the attention of Stormwater Grant, Town of Jupiter Utilities, 17403 Central Blvd, Jupiter, FL 33458. If an application is submitted by email, make sure to include "Private SW Improvement Grant Application" in the subject line and request a read receipt to ensure it was received.

A committee will review all applications and the Town Council will make awards based on benefit to the regional stormwater system. Proposals should only include capital improvements to facilities that reduce existing flooding and/or produce benefits to water quality. Routine maintenance tasks are not eligible for funding.


Town of Jupiter to Begin Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) Water Meter Upgrade

As part of the Town's ongoing improvements to ensure delivery of safe, high-quality potable water to our customers, the Utilities Department will begin a system-wide upgrade of water metering equipment in Spring 2026, with anticipated completion in January 2028.

Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) is state-of-the-art metering technology in use by most water utilities nationwide. AMI provides advanced metering technology with improved accuracy and near real-time access to usage data for both customers and utility staff. Early detection of leaks or other unusual water consumption trends will be more easily recognized with AMI, resulting in improved response time and consumer satisfaction, and cost savings associated with wasted water and water damage. AMI transmits encrypted metering data over a secure network to the Town's Utility databases for access by Town of Jupiter Utility Customer Service staff. Customers will also have access to their water consumption data via an online portal and smart device app.

AMI will provide these key benefits:

- Daily reads for faster response and better service
- Early leak detection and high-bill alerts
- Customer access to real-time usage data by an online portal and mobile app
- Improved customer engagement that encourages conservation
- Reliable and accurate meter readings
- Improved system maintenance


Be a Good Neighbor - Mind Your Parking!

The Town of Jupiter updated its parking regulations in 2012 to address parking concerns identified by the Town and its residents. As a reminder, regulations remain in effect that clarify where passenger vehicles, trucks, boats, trailers and recreational vehicles may be parked, including in front, side-corner and rear yards, as well as in swales.

Practicing proper parking will not only keep you from being cited but will provide a safer environment for pedestrians and cyclists. For instance, a vehicle is improperly parked over a sidewalk if pedestrians must walk into a street to get around it. Improper parking may impact bike safety and child safety and create hazards for individuals with mobility limitations.

Residents should also be aware that vehicles parked in front yards have the potential to block the visibility of the front door of a home or limit the emergency access to a home.

Additionally, it is also a violation to park cars or recreational vehicles overnight in a public right of way, such as along A1A. So be a good neighbor and be sure to properly park your cars, boats and recreational vehicles. You'll avoid a ticket and you'll be doing your part to help increase the safety of our streets and neighborhoods.




Hurricane Season Starts June 1 Have a Plan Before It Starts

Hurricanes are part of life for Floridians, and as Floridians know, having a plan for your family, your property and your business is important. Similarly, the Town hopes for the best and prepares for the worst in its storm and severe weather preparations. In the event of a storm, the Town activates its Emergency Operations Center (EOC) in the Town Hall building. Members of law enforcement, Town management, communications and Information Systems gather at the EOC to manage activities before, during and after the storm. The Town's Chief of Police acts as Incident Commander during any emergency, coordinating operations among groups of essential staff to ensure the safety of the community.

To prepare, create your family or business hurricane plan before the start of hurricane season on June 1. Consider whether or not you will leave the area if a storm threatens, find out where your nearest shelter is located, create a supply list and organize a plan for pets, boats, homes and other property.

Every Drop Counts: Water Conservation in Jupiter

The Town of Jupiter remains committed to proactive water conservation in partnership with the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD). As part of this effort, year-round irrigation restrictions apply to all properties within the Town of Jupiter boundary and water service area.

Below are the permissible irrigation days and times for all properties not using reclaimed or reuse wastewater for irrigation.

Address	Days	Time
Odd-numbered addresses	Mondays, Wednesdays, and/or Saturdays	4:00 pm – 10:00 am
Even-numbered addresses*	Tuesdays, Thursdays, and/or Sundays	4:00 pm – 10:00 am

* Even- and odd-numbered addresses that share the same irrigation system or zone should follow the schedule for even-numbered addresses. This includes multi-family units and homeowner associations where applicable.

Protect Jupiter's Natural Water Resources by Avoiding Fertilizer Use During the Rainy Season

Jupiter's annual fertilizer ban goes into effect June 1 and continues through September 30. The Ordinance, passed by the Town Council in 2018, prohibits the use of fertilizers containing nitrogen or phosphorus during the rainy season for the preservation of water quality in Jupiter's waterways. The ban applies to residents and lawn care businesses. Farms, golf courses, and athletic fields are exempt but are encouraged to limit use. Use of fertilizers without these nutrients are allowed. 
Join the Jupiter C.L.E.A.N. Campaign and Help Keep the Community Litter-Free
